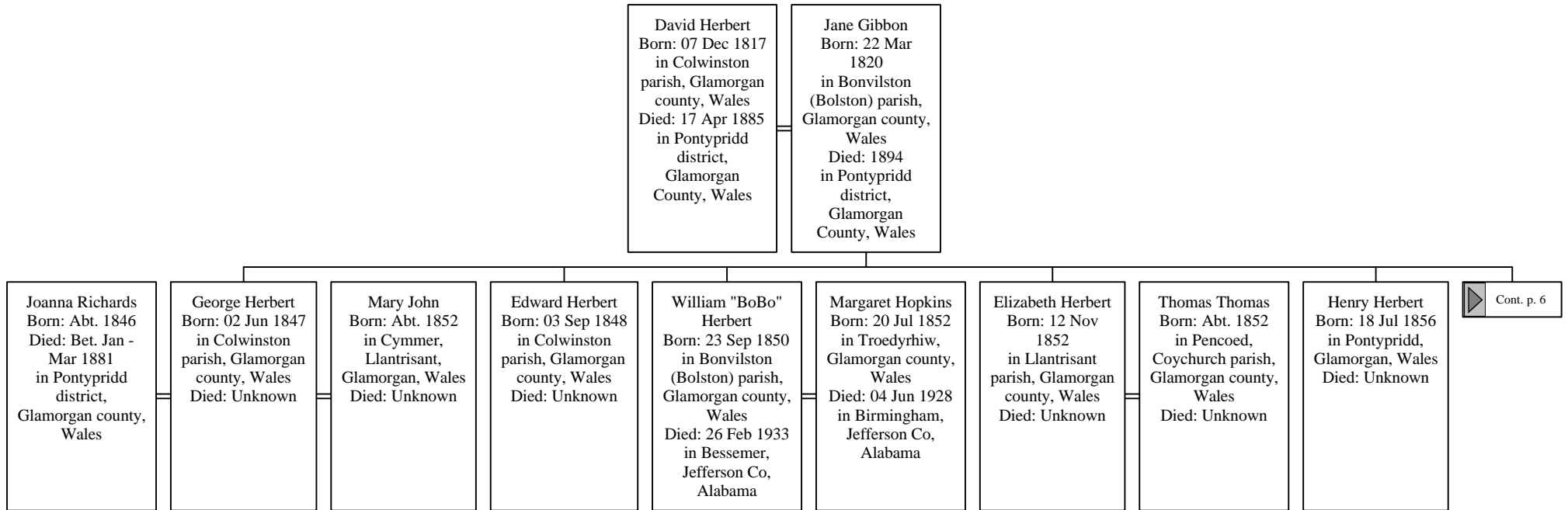

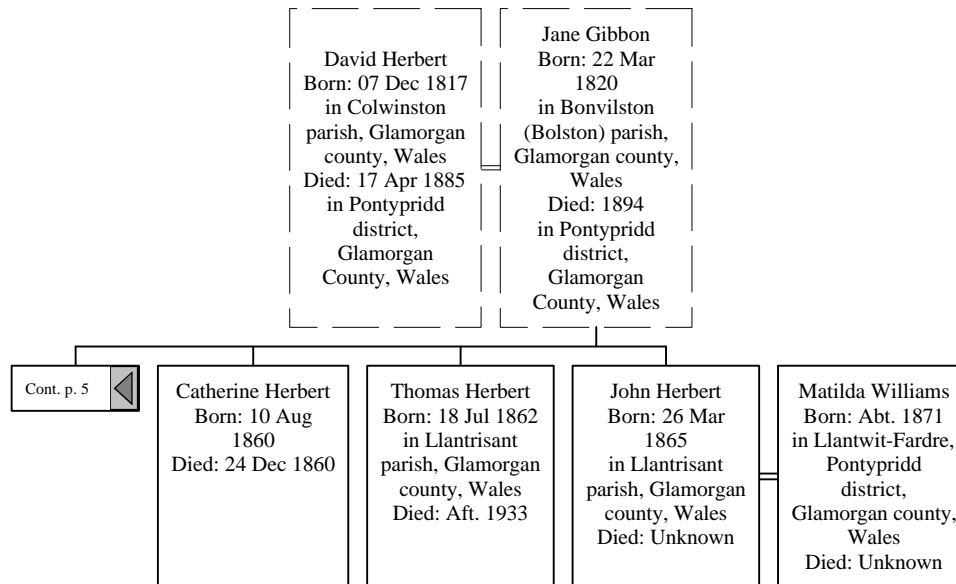

Generation No. 1

1. DAVID¹ HERBERT¹ was born 07 Dec 1817 in Colwinston parish, Glamorgan county, Wales^{2,3}, and died 17 Apr 1885 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan County, Wales^{4,5}. He married JANE GIBBON^{6,7,8} Jul 1846 in Bridgend district, Glamorgan county, Wales⁹. She was born 22 Mar 1820 in Bonvilston (Bolston) parish, Glamorgan county, Wales^{10,11}, and died 1894 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan County, Wales¹².

Notes for DAVID HERBERT:

David may be the son of Kate Herbert, thatcher's widow, living in Colwinstone parish in 1851. She is 73, born about 1778, and born in Tythegstone parish. Living with her are two of her children William, 37 and a thatcher, and Katherine, 29. Both William and Katherine were born in Colwinstone.

David Herbert was born 7 Dec 1817. [6]

In 1851 David Herbert is living in Colwinstone parish, Glamorgan county, Wales. He is 33, a thatcher, and was born in Colwinstone. Living with him are his wife Jane, 31 & born in Bonvilstone parish, and sons George, 3, Edward, 2, and William, 5 months. All the children were born in Colwinstone. [5]

In 1861, David Herbert is living in Llantwit Fardre parish, Glamorgan county, Wales. He is 43, a coal miner, and was born in Bonvilston parish, Glamorgan. Living with him are his wife Jane, 41, and children George, 13, Edward, 12, William, 10, Elizabeth, 8, and Henry, 4. All the children were born in Colwinston except Henry who was born in Llantwit Fardre. George is a coalminer like his father. The other children are in school. [4]

In 1871 David Herbert is living in the town of Cymmer, Llantrisant parish, Glamorgan county, Wales. He is 53 years old and was born in Colwinston parish, Glamorgan. David is a coal miner. Living with him are his wife Jane, 51, and their children. Jane was born in Bonvilston parish, Glamorgan. Their children are William, 20, Elizabeth, 18, Henry, 14, Thomas, 8, and John, 6. William and Henry are coal miners like their father. [1]

In 1881 David Herbert is living in Cymmer. He is 63 years old and a stone quarryman. David was born in Colwinston parish. Living with him is his wife Jane, 61, and their children Henry, 24, Thomas, 18, and John, 16. Also in the house is a lodger George Herbert [son of David], 33, born in Ogmores Valley parish, Glamorgan, and three additional children. The children are Charles Herbert, dau. [s.b. son], male, age 13, born in Ogmores Valley, David [son of George], son, male, age 4, born in Ogmores Valley, and William [son of George], son, male, age 1, born in Llantrisant. Even though the three younger children are identified as David's children, I think David and William are his grandsons, the sons of George. Charles's relationship has not yet been determined. [2]

David died on 17 April 1885 in the second quarter at age 67 (born about 1818) in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [3, 6]

Jane Gibbon was born 22 March 1820. [4]

In 1861 Jane is with her family in Llantwit Fardre parish, Glamorgan county, Wales. She is 41, born in Colwinston parish, Glamorgan, and is a tailoress. [3]

In 1891 Jane Herbert is living in the town of Cymmer, Llantrisant parish, Glamorgan county, Wales. She is 71 years old, widowed, and was born in Bolvinston parish, Glamorgan. Living with her are her son Henry, 34, and daughter Elizabeth Thomas, 38, and her family. [1]

Jane may be the Jane Herbert who died in the last quarter of 1894 at age 74 (born about 1820) in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [2]

Notes for GEORGE HERBERT:

In 1861, when he was 13 years old, George was a coalminer like his father. [1]

George married his first wife Joanna Richards in 1875; she died in 1881, before the census in April of that year.

In 1881 George Herbert is living in Llantrisant in the home of his parents. He is 33, a coal miner and was Colwinston parish. With George are his two sons, age 4, born in

Ogmore Valley, and William, age 1, born in Llantrisant. [2]

In 1891 George Herbert is living in Cymmer, Llandtrisant district, Glamorgan. He is 43 and a collier miner, born in Colwinstone. With him are his wife Mary, 39, sons David, 14, and William, 11, daughter Jane, 2, and mother-in-law Janet John, 71. George, Mary and their sons can speak both Welsh and English. Jane and Janet speak only Welsh. [3]

In 1901 George Herbert is living in Llantrisant, districts of Ystradyfodwg, Cymmer & Porth, and Rhondda in Glamorgan. He is 54 born in Colwinstone. George is a licensed R..., possibly a pub owner, as the unreadable word on the census had pub written above it. With George are his wife Mary, 49, son William, 27 [should be 22], coal miner, William's wife Elizabeth, 27, and their son George, 1. [4]

Joanna is probably the Juanna Herbert born abt 1846 who died in the 1st quarter (Jan - Mar) 1881 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan. [1]

In 1871 Mary is probably the Mary John, 19, born in Llantrisant, Glamorgan, living in Cymmer with her parents Edward and Jannette John. Mary is a dressmaker. [1]

Notes for WILLIAM HERBERT:

The names of William's parents David Herbert and Jane (last name unknown) were provided by G. Herbert (Gwylm) on William's death certificate. Jane Gibbon's name was found in Willam Herbert's diary from 1886-1887.

William reported his birth in Trebanogbyonmer. [9] This may be the village of Trebanog, today in the Rhondda-Cynon-Taff district in Glamorgan county. Trebanog is close to Porth, and not too far from Pontypridd.

William may be the William Herbert born in the 4th quarter (Oct - Dec) 1850 in Bridgend district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [8]

A wedding announcement for one of the Herberts reported that William and Margaret emigrated from Porth Rhonda, Wales. [2]

On 2 Apr 1880, William & Margaret's church the Welsh Independent Chapel in Porth presented them with a bible on the occasion of their immigration to the US. [5]

The Herberts probably arrived in New York on 19 April 1880 on the ship Celtic from Liverpool. Listed on the passenger list is Wm Herbert, laborer, Mrs Herbert, wife, and Willie, age 3. They are shown on the passenger list as English. Several pages into the list is Wm Hurbert/Herbert, male infant. Several infants were listed on this page independent of their families. This infant is probably Sadie, who was 2 in April 1880, and is listed under her father's name instead of her own. [7]

The Herbert's came to Ohio when they first immigrated to the U.S. in 1880. Gwylm and Sadie (Sarah) were both born in Wales.

The 1880 Census (15 June 1880) William Herbert is living in the village of Bridgeport, Pease township, Belmont County, Ohio. He is 30 years old, a coal miner and born in Wales. Living with him are his wife Margaret, 27, and children William [Gwylm], 3, and Sarah J, 2. All were born in Wales. William and Margaret are sharing a house (same dwelling number on the census) with Thomas Harris and his family. Thomas is also a coal miner and was born in Wales. His children (ages 7 to 2 months) were born in Ohio.

Bridgeport and Martins Ferry (where it is sometimes reported that daughter Maggie was born) are in Belmont County, Ohio, on the Ohio River, across from the narrow, northwest tip of West Virginia. Continuing due east is Pennsylvania.

William began a diary in Welsh on 28 November 1886 in Bridgeport, Belmont County, Ohio, and ended it two months later on 28 January 1887. [10]

The Herberts moved to Alabama from Ohio between 1887 (when William's diary ends) and 1890 (when he appears in the Birmingham city directory).

In 1890 Wm Herbert is living at 1 street avenue, N [North?] in Birmingham, Alabama. William is a superintendent of coal mines working for Brookside. [3] Brookside Coal mine was opened in 1886 by the Coalburg Coal and Coke Company. It was purchased one year later by the Sloss Iron and Steel Company as a source of fuel for their blast furnaces in Birmingham. Brookside served as the headquarters for four Sloss-owned mines in the immediate area (Cardiff, Coalburg, Brazil and Brookside). [4]

In 1895 William Herbert is a manager for Paint Rock Coal Mines. He is living in Birmingham at Underwood ave and 10th st in the East Lake area of Birmingham. He lived on Underwood ave until 1898 or 99. In 1897 William is working for the Thomas Coal Co. In 1897 he is a superintendent for Little Warrior Mines. [6]

In 1898 William Herbert succeeded L W Jones as superintendent of the mines at Belle Ellen [Bibb County, Alabama]. William was at one time superintendent at Brookside, but of [late ?] years has been living in Arkansas. [11] The report of William living in Arkansas, presumably the state, is not supported by the available information in the Birmingham City directories. [CAR]

In the 1900 Census, William is living in Kingdom township, Bibb County, Alabama. He is 50 years old, born in Wales, and a superintendent at the coal mine, probably the Belle Ellen mine. His wife Margaret is 47 and was also born in Wales. William and Margaret have been married 24 years. They immigrated in 1880. Margaret has had 7 children, 6 are living. Living with them are their daughters Elisabeth, 18, Maggie, 15, Annie M, 9, and Mabel G (or S), 7. Elisabeth and Maggie were born in Ohio; Annie and Mabel in Alabama. Living with them are two boarders Robert and Marion Hopkins, and a black servant Edward Parker. Living nearby, on the next census page, is Charles Hager and his mother Marie. Charles Hager and Maggie Herbert married in Bibb County in 1902.

In 1902 William Herbert is a superintendent for the Bessemer Land & Imp [Improvement] Company. He is living in Lopez, (Bibb County) Alabama. [6]

In 1903 William, superintendent of the Bessemer Land Improvement Company's mines in Bibb County, testified before the Board of Arbitration to settle differences between the Alabama miners and coal operators. [12]

William & Margaret moved to Bessemer about 1904. [1]

In 1907 William is a mine operator with his address in Birmingham listed as 1012 First National Bank building. He is living in Bessemer. [6]

In the 1910 Census, William is living in Bessemer, Alabama, at 721 17th Street. He is 56 years old, born in Wales, and immigrated in 1879. William is a naturalized citizen. Living with him are his wife Margaret, 55, of Wales, and daughters, Lizzie, 25, born in Ohio, Annie M, 19, born in Alabama, and Mabel, 18, born in Alabama. William and Margaret have been married for 34 years. Margaret has born 7 children, 6 are still living. William is an operator in the mines. Son Gwylym is living around the corner and on the next census page with his wife and son.

Between 1910 and 1920 William and Margaret built the house at 1530 6th Avenue in Bessemer, where they remained for the rest of their lives. After their deaths daughters Gia and Mabel lived in the house. It was still standing in 2005.

In the 1920 Census, William is living in Bessemer, at 1530 Sixth Avenue. He is 69 years old and working at a mine. His exact occupation is unclear. Living with him are his wife Margaret, daughter Elizabeth, and son-in-law and daughter Albert H and Mabel Smith.

In the 1930 Census, William and his daughter Elizabeth are living in Bessemer, Alabama, at 1530 Sixth Avenue. William is 79 years old, born in Wales. He is retired (his occupation is "none"). His native language is Welsh. He came to the United States in 1880. It was unclear on the Census if he was naturalized. Living next door are daughter Mabel, with her husband Albert Smith and their daughter Elizabeth.

William's obituary called him one of the industrial leaders of Bessemer area.

William died at home on February 26, 1933. He was a retired superintendent of the coal mines. He had been sick and attended by his physician since January 15. His cause of death was arterio-sclerosis (or hardening of the arteries) and cerebral apoplexy (a stroke). He also had pneumonia when he died. [1]

Notes for MARGARET HOPKINS:

The names of Margaret's parents, William Hopkins and Kathrine Jones, were provided by her husband William Herbert on her death certificate.

Margaret Hopkins was born in Troedyrhiw. [2] Toedyrhiw is in the Merthyr district, Glamorgan county.

Margaret got mad at her mother and left home at age 17. She set up a sewing group to earn her living. [4]

She is supposed to have sung at Buckingham Palace for Queen Victoria. [3]

Margaret was about four months pregnant with son David when the family immigrated in April 1880. He was born that September and died three months later.

Margaret died at Baptist Hospital in Birmingham, Alabama, June 4 1928. She had been attended by her physician since January. Margaret had cancer of the stomach which had metastasized into the liver. She was operated on June 4th, and must have died in surgery, as her time of death was 9:10 AM. A partial autopsy was performed.

Thomas is a coal miner. Living with him is his wife Elizabeth, 28, born in Tregolwyn, Glamorgan, and their children Margaret J, 5, and Edward, 2, both born in Llantrisant parish, Glamorgan. [2]

In 1891, Thomas Thomas is living in Cymmer, Llantrisant parish, Glamorgan, Wales, in the home of his mother-in-law Jane Herbert. He is 39 years old, born in Pencoed, Glamorgan, and a coal miner. With him is his wife Elizabeth, 38, born in Bolwinston, Glamorgan, and their two sons, Edward, 12, born in Trebanog, Glamorgan, and David, 2, born in Cymmer. [1]

She is most likely the Catherine Herbert who was born in the 3rd quarter (July - Sept) 1860 in Cardiff district, Glamorgan County, Wales, and died in the 4th quarter (Oct - Dec) of that year. [2, 3]

Notes for JOHN HERBERT:

In 1881, John was living with his parents in Cymmer. He was 16 years old, born in Llantrisant parish, Glamorgan, and was working as a blacksmith apprentice. [1]

In 1891, John Herbert is living in Brittonia Hafod, Llantwitfarde, Pontypridd district, Glamorgan. He is 26, born in Llantmant, and a blacksmith. With John are his wife Matilda, 20, and daughter Jane, 3 months. John and Matilda speak both Welsh and English. [2]

John and Matilda reportedly went to the United States between the birth of son Gwilym in 1892 and daughter Lilian in 1895 in the United States. They had returned by 1901. [3]

Only their three children have been found on the 1901 census. They were living with their grandparents Wm and Eliz Williams in Lantwit Fardre. It may be that John and Matilda were living elsewhere, but they have not been found on the England & Wales census for that year, and may have died in the United States. [CAR]

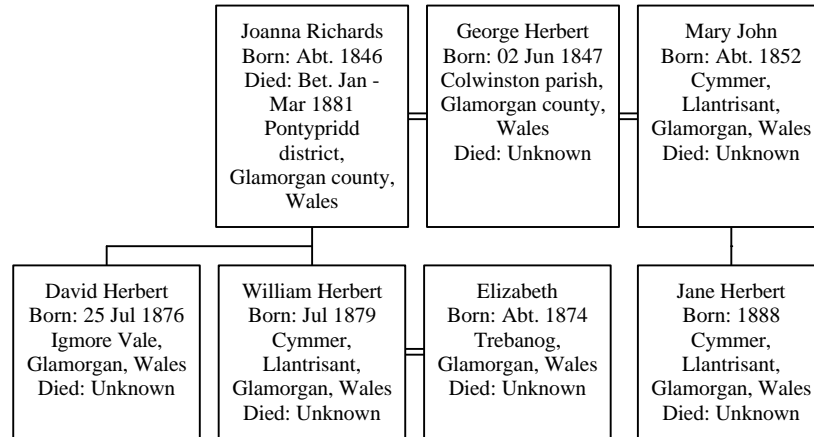

Notes for GEORGE HERBERT:

In 1861, when he was 13 years old, George was a coalminer like his father. [1]

George married his first wife Joanna Richards in 1875; she died in 1881, before the census in April of that year.

In 1881 George Herbert is living in Llantrissant in the home of his parents. He is 33, a coal miner and was Colwinston parish. With George are his two sons, age 4, born in Ogmore Valley, and William, age 1, born in Llantrissant. [2]

In 1891 George Herbert is living in Cymmer, Llandtrissant district, Glamorgan. He is 43 and a collier miner, born in Colwinstone. With him are his wife Mary, 39, sons David, 14, and William, 11, daughter Jane, 2, and mother-in-law Janet John, 71. George, Mary and their sons can speak both Welsh and English. Jane and Janet speak only Welsh. [3]

In 1901 George Herbert is living in Llantrissant, districts of Ystradyfodwg, Cymmer & Porth, and Rhondda in Glamorgan. He is 54 born in Colwinstone. George is a licensed R..., possibly a pub owner, as the unreadable word on the census had pub written above it. With George are his wife Mary, 49, son William, 27 [should be 22], coal miner, William's wife Elizabeth, 27, and their son George, 1. [4]

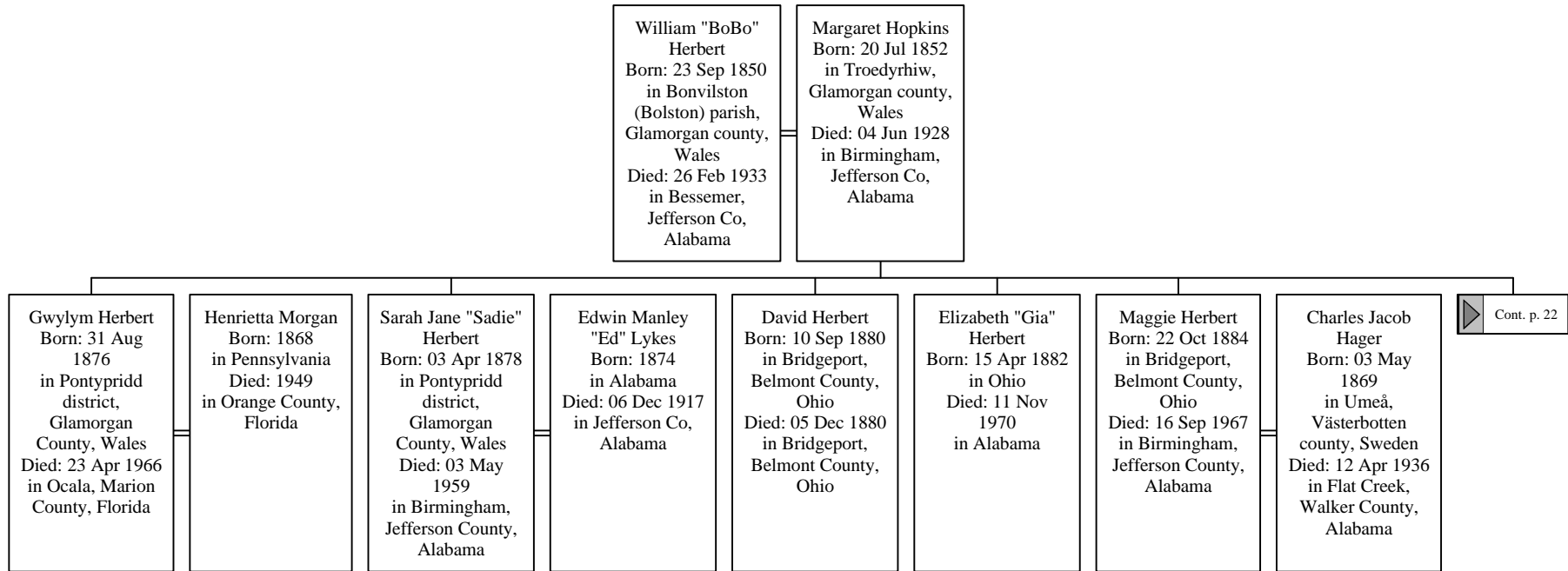

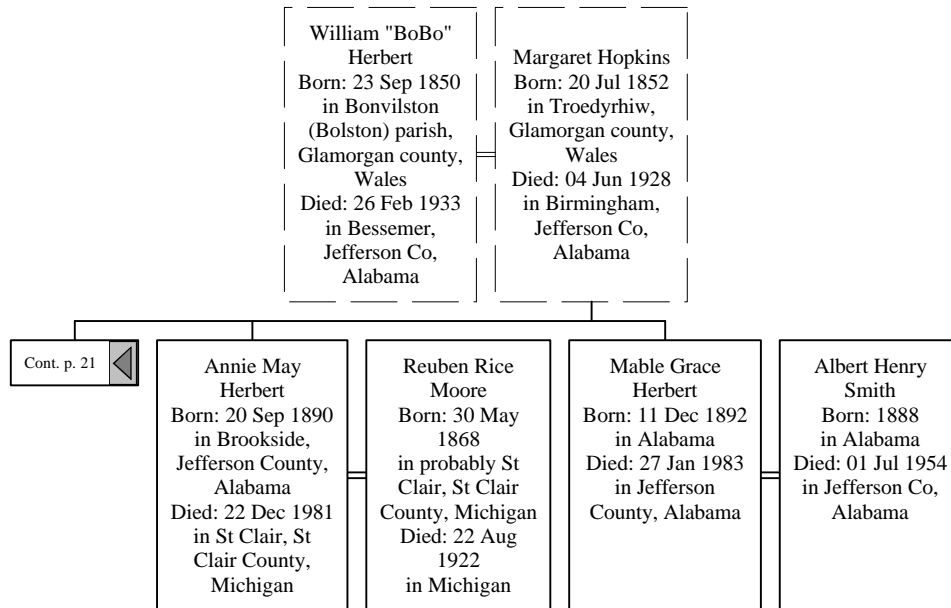

1. WILLIAM² HERBERT (*DAVID*¹) was born 23 Sep 1850 in Bonvilston (Bolston) parish, Glamorgan county, Wales^{1,2}, and died 26 Feb 1933 in Bessemer, Jefferson Co, Alabama³. He married MARGARET HOPKINS 09 Aug 1875 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan County, Wales^{4,5}, daughter of WILLIAM HOPKINS and KATHRINE JONES. She was born 20 Jul 1852 in Troedyrhiw, Glamorgan county, Wales^{6,7}, and died 04 Jun 1928 in Birmingham, Jefferson Co, Alabama⁸.

Notes for WILLIAM HERBERT:

The names of William's parents David Herbert and Jane (last name unknown) were provided by G. Herbert (Gwylym) on William's death certificate. Jane Gibbon's name was found in Willam Herbert's diary from 1886-1887.

William reported his birth in Trebanogbyonmer. [9] This may be the village of Trebanog, today in the Rhondda-Cynon-Taff district in Glamorgan county. Trebanog is close to Porth, and not too far from Pontypridd.

William may be the William Herbert born in the 4th quarter (Oct - Dec) 1850 in Bridgend district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [8]

A wedding announcement for one of the Herberts reported that William and Margaret emigrated from Porth Rhonda, Wales. [2]

On 2 Apr 1880, William & Margaret's church the Welsh Independent Chapel in Porth presented them with a bible on the occasion of their immigration to the US. [5]

The Herberts probably arrived in New York on 19 April 1880 on the ship Celtic from Liverpool. Listed on the passenger list is Wm Herbert, laborer, Mrs Herbert, wife, and Willie, age 3. They are shown on the passenger list as English. Several pages into the list is Wm Hurbert/Herbert, male infant. Several infants were listed on this page independent of their families. This infant is probably Sadie, who was 2 in April 1880, and is listed under her father's name instead of her own. [7]

The Herbert's came to Ohio when they first immigrated to the U.S. in 1880. Gwylym and Sadie (Sarah) were both born in Wales.

The 1880 Census (15 June 1880) William Herbert is living in the village of Bridgeport, Pease township, Belmont County, Ohio. He is 30 years old, a coal miner and born in Wales. Living with him are his wife Margaret, 27, and children William [Gwylym], 3, and Sarah J, 2. All were born in Wales. William and Margaret are sharing a house (same dwelling number on the census) with Thomas Harris and his family. Thomas is also a coal miner and was born in Wales. His children (ages 7 to 2 months) were born in Ohio.

Bridgeport and Martins Ferry (where it is sometimes reported that daughter Maggie was born) are in Belmont County, Ohio, on the Ohio River, across from the narrow, northwest tip of West Virginia. Continuing due east is Pennsylvania.

William began a diary in Welsh on 28 November 1886 in Bridgeport, Belmont County, Ohio, and ended it two months later on 28 January 1887. [10]

The Herberts moved to Alabama from Ohio between 1887 (when William's diary ends) and 1890 (when he appears in the Birmingham city directory).

In 1890 Wm Herbert is living at 1 street avenue, N [North?] in Birmingham, Alabama. William is a superintendent of coal mines working for Brookside. [3] Brookside Coal mine was opened in 1886 by the Coalburg Coal and Coke Company. It was purchased one year later by the Sloss Iron and Steel Company as a source of fuel for their blast furnaces in Birmingham. Brookside served as the headquarters for four Sloss-owned mines in the immediate area (Cardiff, Coalburg, Brazil and Brookside). [4]

In 1895 William Herbert is a manager for Paint Rock Coal Mines. He is living in Birmingham at Underwood ave and 10th st in the East Lake area of Birmingham. He lived on Underwood ave until 1898 or 99. In 1897 William is working for the Thomas Coal Co. In 1897 he is a superintendent for Little Warrior Mines. [6]

In 1898 William Herbert succeeded L W Jones as superintendent of the mines at Belle Ellen [Bibb County, Alabama]. William was at one time superintendent at Brookside, but of [late ?] years has been living in Arkansas. [11] The report of William living in Arkansas, presumably the state, is not supported by the available information in the Birmingham City directories. [CAR]

In the 1900 Census, William is living in Kingdom township, Bibb County, Alabama. He is 50 years old, born in Wales, and a superintendent at the coal mine, probably the Belle Ellen mine. His wife Margaret is 47 and was also born in Wales. William and Margaret have been married 24 years. They immigrated in 1880. Margaret has had 7 children, 6 are living. Living with them are their daughters Elisabeth, 18, Maggie, 15, Annie M, 9, and Mabel G (or S), 7. Elisabeth and Maggie were born in Ohio; Annie and Mabel in Alabama. Living with them are two boarders Robert and Marion Hopkins, and a black servant Edward Parker. Living nearby, on the next census page, is Charles Hager and his mother Marie. Charles Hager and Maggie Herbert married in Bibb County in 1902.

In 1902 William Herbert is a superintendent for the Bessemer Land & Imp [Improvement] Company. He is living in Lopez, (Bibb County) Alabama. [6]

In 1903 William, superintendent of the Bessemer Land Improvement Company's mines in Bibb County, testified before the Board of Arbitration to settle differences between the Alabama miners and coal operators. [12]

William & Margaret moved to Bessemer about 1904. [1]

In 1907 William is a mine operator with his address in Birmingham listed as 1012 First National Bank building. He is living in Bessemer. [6]

In the 1910 Census, William is living in Bessemer, Alabama, at 721 17th Street. He is 56 years old, born in Wales, and immigrated in 1879. William is a naturalized citizen. Living with him are his wife Margaret, 55, of Wales, and daughters, Lizzie, 25, born in Ohio, Annie M, 19, born in Alabama, and Mabel, 18, born in Alabama. William and Margaret have been married for 34 years. Margaret has born 7 children, 6 are still living. William is an operator in the mines. Son Gwylym is living around the corner and on the next census page with his wife and son.

Between 1910 and 1920 William and Margaret built the house at 1530 6th Avenue in Bessemer, where they remained for the rest of their lives. After their deaths daughters Gia and Mabel lived in the house. It was still standing in 2005.

In the 1920 Census, William is living in Bessemer, at 1530 Sixth Avenue. He is 69 years old and working at a mine. His exact occupation is unclear. Living with him are his wife Margaret, daughter

Elizabeth, and son-in-law and daughter Albert H and Mabel Smith.

In the 1930 Census, William and his daughter Elizabeth are living in Bessemer, Alabama, at 1530 Sixth Avenue. William is 79 years old, born in Wales. He is retired (his occupation is "none"). His native language is Welsh. He came to the United States in 1880. It was unclear on the Census if he was naturalized. Living next door are daughter Mabel, with her husband Albert Smith and their daughter Elizabeth.

William's obituary called him one of the industrial leaders of Bessemer area.

William died at home on February 26, 1933. He was a retired superintendent of the coal mines. He had been sick and attended by his physician since January 15. His cause of death was arterio-sclerosis (or hardening of the arteries) and cerebral apoplexy (a stroke). He also had pneumonia when he died. [1]

Margaret Hopkins was born in Troedyrhiw. [2] Toedyrhiw is in the Merthyr district, Glamorgan county.

Margaret got mad at her mother and left home at age 17. She set up a sewing group to earn her living. [4]

She is supposed to have sung at Buckingham Palace for Queen Victoria. [3]

Margaret was about four months pregnant with son David when the family immigrated in April 1880. He was born that September and died three months later.

Margaret died at Baptist Hospital in Birmingham, Alabama, June 4 1928. She had been attended by her physician since January. Margaret had cancer of the stomach which had metastasized into the liver. She was operated on June 4th, and must have died in surgery, as her time of death was 9:10 AM. A partial autopsy was performed. [1]

Notes for GWYLYM HERBERT:

Gwylym [Gwylym] Herbert's birth was registered in the quarter ending September 1876 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [1]

In 1895 William [should be Gwylym] Herbert is a student living in Birmingham, Alabama, with his parents at Underwood ave & 10th st in the East Lake area. [5]

From 1897 to 1900 Gwylym Herbert is a librarian at the Birmingham Public Library. He resides at Underwood ave in East Lake until 1899. In 1900 he is living at 606 N 21st. [5]

In 1900, Gwylym is probably the William Herbert living with his sister Sarah and her husband Edwin Lykes (Edward on the census) in Birmingham, Jefferson Co, Alabama.

The census taker records William's birthdate as May 1874 (should be Aug 1876) and his birthplace as Georgia (should be Wales). William appears to be a clerk in a shoe store. (The census taker has all the birthdates in the Lykes house incorrect according to my records, so it is likely that this is Gwylm - CAR 10/2004.)

In 1901 & 1902 Gwylm Herbert is secretary & treasurer for Bondurant Lloyd Company in Birmingham. In 1901, Gwylm is living at 1717 7th ave in Birmingham; in 1902 he is living in Bessemer. [5]

In the 1910 Census, Gwylm is living at 612 16th Street in Bessemer, Jefferson Co, Alabama. His parents and three sisters are living around the corner, and on the previous census page. Gwylm is 34, and was born in England (should be Wales). He is a baker. Living with him are his wife Etta M, 38, and son William, 2. Etta was born in Pennsylvania and her parents in Wales. William was born in Alabama. Gwylm and Henrietta have been married 4 years.

On Sept 12, 1918, Gwylm Herbert registered for the WWI military draft. He was living in Lady Lake, Lake Co, Florida. Herbert was 42 years old, born on August 31, 1876, and a naturalized citizen. He was a farmer. His wife Henrietta Morgan[?] Herbert was listed as his next of kin.

In the 1920 Census, Gwylm (Goodwin Herbert on the Census) is living in Lady Lake, Lake Co., Florida. He is 44 years old, and was born in Wales. He immigrated to the US in 1879, and is a naturalized citizen, possibly in 1896. Gwylm is a farmer. (The industry is listed as manager? Maybe he was a manager on a farm.) Living with him are his wife Henrietta, 50, born in Pennsylvania, and son William, 12, born in Alabama.

In the 1930 Census, Gwylm (Gillian Herbert on the Census) is living in Birmingham, Alabama, on 6th Avenue South. He is 54 years old, born in Wales. He is a secretary for a church. Living with him are his wife Henrietta N, age 52, and their son William M, age 22. William is in school. They are living in a house also occupied by Charles & Carrie Reynolds, perhaps a subdivided house.

The obituary for Gwylm's father William (1933) lists his residence as Birmingham. The obituary for his sister Sadie (1959), lists Gwylm's residence as Lady Lake, Florida.

By 1949, Gwylm was living in Florida when his wife Henrietta died in Orange County.

In addition to farming, Gwylm was also the post master at Lady Lake. [6]

Gwylm Herbert was living in Lady Lake, Florida, when he died in an Ocala hospital. Gwylm was a native of Pontytridd [sic] Wales, a graduate of Howard College, secretary of 56th Street Baptist Church for several years and once owned a bakery in Bessemer. He also helped organize the Southern Baptist BYPU. [4]

Gwylm Herbert was born August 31, 1876, and died April 1966 in Marion County, Florida. [2, 3]

Notes for SARAH JANE HERBERT:

Sarah Jane Herbert's birth was registered in the quarter ending June 1878 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [2]

In 1897 Miss Sadie J Herbert is living in Birmingham, Alabama, with her parents on Underwood ave in the East Lake area. In 1899 her mother-in-law Matilda Lykes was also living on Underwood. [4]

According to a RootsWeb post, Sadie had five children - Matilda, Annie, Mabel, Herbert, and Margaret. I believe Annie was a mistake, corrected on a later post, although they were hard to follow. [2000 RootsWeb Herbert message board exchange between Peggy Alexander, granddaughter of Margaret Lykes Counts & Ann Rogers, descended from Annie Herbert Moore. I have been unable to make contact with them. CAR 1/2004]

After the death of Edwin in 1917, Sadie started making sandwiches that she carried down to the elementary school down the street to sell to support herself and her children. When Woodlawn high school opened, she ran the cafeteria. [3]

In the 1920 Census, Mrs Edwin Lykes (Edwin M Lyker on Ancestry.com's index) is living at 319(?) 50th Street in Birmingham, Alabama. She is 41 years old and widowed. Sadie was born in Alabama and her parents in Wales. She is not working. Living with her are her children Margaret, 21, Helen, 19, Matilda, 14, and Herbert, 10. Margaret & Helen appear to be both working as stenographers for the rail road.

In 1930, Sarah J Lykes is living in Birmingham, Alabama, at 829 50th Street North. She is 52 years old and widowed. Sarah is a dietitian at a public school. Her and her parents' birthplaces are listed as England, but the language she spoke before coming to the United States was Welsh. Living with her are her daughter Matilda N, son Herbert, and James C Carter, a boarder. Matilda is 23 years old, and a teacher in the public school. Herbert is 20 and is not working. [1]

An undated newspaper clipping in the Lykes file at Oak Hill Cemetery reports that Mrs. Sadie Lykes, known as "Mother Lykes", was recovering from severe bruises suffered in a fall at the dining hall of Camp Winnetaska near Pell City where she was dietitian. She stumbled while carrying a tray and was knocked unconscious by the fall.

Before her retirement in 1954, Sadie was a dietitian at Woodlawn High School during the school term and at Camp Winnetaska during the summers. She taught a Sunday school class at West Woodlawn Babtist Church for 50 years. [obituary]

At her death, Sadie was survived by her son Herbert Edwin Lykes, and three daughters Mrs. J. C. Counts, Mrs. James M. Jackson, Jr., and Mrs. O. W. Daniel, all of Birmingham. She was also survived by her brother and four sisters. [obituary]

Ed Lykes is probably the same Edwin N. Lykes found in the 1880 Census (familysearch.org) in Township 16, Jefferson County, AL. He is 6 yeas old, born about

1874, and living with his father John M. Lykes, farmer, son John D. Lykes, age 16, daughter G. A. Lykes, age 14, and sister Velmer Lykes, age 2. John Lykes's wife is M. M. Lykes, age 22. This is probably incorrect, M. M. Lykes was probably 32 years old in this census, based on the tombstone for Matilda Lykes in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Velma Lykes Milner was buried in October 1969 in Oak Hill Cemetery in Birmingham, AL. She was 91 years old when she died, consistent with the Velmer Lykes, sister of Edwin. [2]

In 1898 Edwin M Lykes is a clerk for T C King. He is living on 15th st in the East Lake area of Birmingham. In 1899 Edwin is a salesman for T C King living in East Lake. T. Charles King had a store selling shoes and men's furnishings at 1916 1st ave. In 1900 Edw M Lykes is a clerk for T C King, living at 705 S 20th. In 1901 he is living in the Woodlawn area. [3]

In the 1900 Census, Edward M Lykes is living in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama. He is 27 years old and was born in Alabama. His parents were born in Georgia. Edward appears to be a clerk in a shoe store. Living with him is his wife Sarah J, 22. She was born in Wales. Edward and Sarah have been married 3 years, and Sarah has had 2 children; both are living. Their daughters are Margaret, 1, and Willie T, newly born. Willie is probably Helen. The census has Willie born May 1900. This is accurate for Helen, but the remainder of the birth months & years for the occupants appears to be incorrect. Also in the house is William Herbert, a boarder, and Mary Reid, a black servant. The census taker recorded William as born in Georgia in 1874. William is most likely Sarah's brother Gwylym, born 1876 in Wales.

In 1905 Edwin is still clerking for T C King and living in the Velma Station area. In 1907 Edward M Lykes and wife Sadie are living at 701 50th in Woodlawn. Edwin is a salesman for T C King. In 1908 Edward M Lykes is a tailor working for T M Jones, and living at 622 N 50th. [3]

On the 1910 Census, Edwin M Lykes is living on 50th Street North in Birmingham. He is 34 years old and was born in Alabama. He may be a salesman (the census was not clear). Living with him is his wife Sadie H, 31 (?), born in Wales. They have been married 13 years, and Sadie has had 5 children, 4 are living. Their children are Margaret, 11, Helen, 9, Matilda, 5, and E Herbert, less than 1 year. Living next door is Sadie's sister Margaret (Maggie) and her husband Charles Hager and their children.

Edwin died during the flu epidemic of 1917-1918. [1]

In the 1910 Census, Elizabeth (Lizzie on the census) is living in Bessemer with her parents and two youngest sisters. She is 25 years old. Her occupation is none, but I think the census taker put her occupation as her sister's by mistake. She is a teacher in the public school.

In the 1920 Census, Elizabeth is living at home with her parents. She is 28 years old and a kindergarten teacher. (Her correct age is 38.)

In the 1930 Census, Elizabeth is in Bessemer, Alabama, with her father. She is 32 years old and was born in Ohio. She is a dietitian. The type of company or industry she worked for was unclear. (Her correct age is 48.)

Gia was the head of the kitchen at the YMCA. [3]

Gia took care of her parents until their deaths, Margaret in 1928, and William in 1933. After William died, Gia's sister Mabel and her family moved into the house at 1530 6th Avenue with her. [3]

Miss Elizabeth Herbert of 1530 Sixth Avenue North, Bessemer, passed away today [12 Nov 1970]. She was a native of Ohio, a member of the Mentor Club and Bessemer Garden Club, superintendent of the First Baptist Church of Bessemer and employed at Bessemer YMCA. She is survived by her sisters Mrs. Albert Smith of Bessemer and Mrs. Reuben R Moore of St. Clair, Michigan. [2]

Elizabeth Herbert was born April 15, 1882 and died November 1970. Her last residence was in Bessemer, Jefferson county, Alabama. [1]

Margaret completed her education at Judson College, Marion, Alabama. [4]

When her husband Charles killed himself on Easter Sunday, 1936, Maggie's sister Mable and her family were visiting. When the shot inside the house was heard, Maggie said, "Oh no, he's done it." [5]

After Charles died in 1936, the oldest children, John, Henry, Marie, George, and Marguerite helped financially to support Maggie and their younger brothers. [1]

Maggie had long hair that reached to her fanny that she always wore in a bun. [5]

Great-niece remembered that she always had salt cellers on the table.

Maggie had breast cancer that had spread to her lung. The doctors operated but any other treatment she might have had is not remembered. [3] It was always said that Maggie lived 20 years after she was supposed to die, so that would mean she was diagnosed sometime in the late 1940's.

Maggie Hager was a native of Ohio and a member of the Hunter Street Baptist Church. Her last residence was at 1529 41st Street in Belview Heights, Birmingham. She was survived by her daughters Mrs John E Anderson of Lake Placid, Florida, and Mrs H B Frith of New Orleans, and her seven sons John W, Henry J, Charles J, and Paul of Birmingham, George S of Jasper, and Clifton H of Chattanooga, Tennessee. [2]

Notes for CHARLES JACOB HAGER:

Charles was born in Umea, Sweden, May 3, 1869, and was brought by his parents to this country a year later. [8]

He came to the United States from Sweden with his family in 1871 and settled in Alabama that year. [9]

Charles Hager spent his boyhood days at Decatur, Alabama, attending public schools there. He was graduated from high school in 1889 and during 1891 was a student in Smith's Business College, an affiliated institution of the University of Kentucky. After spending a year in the offices of the Louisville & Nashville Railway at Decatur, he entered the employ of the DeBardeleben Coal & Iron Co. at Bessemer. He remained with the same company when a year later it was taken over by the Tennessee Coal, Iron, & Railway Company and was in the service of that great industrial corporation until 1898, acting as yard master. Following that he was assistant superintendent of mines at Belle Ellen for Bessemer Coal, Iron & Land Company until 1904. For two years he was a mine superintendent in Kentucky, and his varied experience as a superintendent of coal mines has extended to many localities in Kentucky, Alabama,

and Virginia.

In 1921 Mr. Hager became mine superintendent at Maxine, Alabama, for the Pratt Consolidated Coal Company. In 1924 the Pratt Company was absorbed by Alabama By-Products Corporation. In the meantime, in 1922 Mr. Hager had transferred to Cordova, where he has since practiced as a superintendent of the Ruby Mine, owned and operated by Alabama By-Products Corporation. This mine has a capacity of five hundred tons of bituminous coal a day, and there are one hundred and fifty employees at the Ruby Mine.

Mr. Hager is owner of farm and mineral lands on Shade Mountain in Jefferson County. His particular service to the government at the time of the World war was in speeding up coal production and for a period of nearly three years, he put in eighteen hours a day under the pressure of extraordinary responsibilities. He is a democrat, a member of the Presbyterian Church at Cordova, and in Masonry is affiliated with Blocton Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, Tuscaloosa Commandery No. 13 Knights Templar and Zamora Temple of the Mystic Shrine at Birmingham. He is a member of the Cordova Kiwanis Club. [8]

He was a pioneer in the coal mining industry in Alabama. With the exception of five years spent in Kentucky and Virginia his work has been confined to mining in Alabama. [9]

Charles' son, Henry, was a life-long employee of Alabama By-Products Corp. [7]

While a young man, Charles worked for a sawmill. Someone was stealing from the sawmill, so Charles was given the task to guard the mill at night and catch this thief. The thief returned, and Charles ended up killing him. Charles' mother Marie thought the best thing in this situation was for Charles to "return home to Sweden". Which he did for some time. [3] Charles left Göteborg (Gothenburg, Sweden) on 28 October 1892 for the United States. Charles arrived in New York City November 17, 1892, on the ship Ethiopia, sailing from Glasgow, with his mother Marie Hager. Charles is a citizen of the United States, born in Sweden, and his most recent residence was in Sweden. Charles is a lumber dealer. Marie's sister Fredericka Swenson (or Svensson) and her three young sons immigrated with them on that trip. [4, 10]

Tom Moxley's (Charles's future grandson-in-law) grandfather Moxley worked for Charles at Belle Ellen mine when the Moxley's first came to Alabama. [Tom Moxley]

When first wife Lillian died in January 1900, Charles was time keeper for the Bessemer Land and Improvement company at Belle Ellen. [11]

In the 1900 Census, Charles J Hager is living in Kingdom township, Bibb County, Alabama. He is 31, widowed, and born in Sweden. Charles is a post master. Living with him is his mother Marie Hager, 63. Charles and Marie immigrated in 1869. Also living with them is William (no last name listed), 17, a black house boy. Living nearby (on the previous census page) is William Herbert and his family. William's daughter Maggie and Charles would marry in 1902.

Charles and Maggie probably lived in Belle Ellen for a year after their marriage. Letters from William Herbert to Maggie and Charles in September and October 1903 indicate they moved out of state, passing through Chattanooga on their way. They may have moved to Kentucky as indicated in Charles' biography in the History of Alabama.

Charles was in Walker County, Alabama, in 1904 and 1906 when sons John and Henry were born.

At the time his mother Marie Hager died in Atlanta in Decemebr 1908, Charles is living at Belle Ellen in Bibb County, Alabama. [1]

In the 1910 Census, Charles is living in Birmingham, Alabama. He is 39 years old, and a manager at a coal mine. Living with him is his wife Maggie (looks like Mattie on the census), 25, and children John W, 5, Henry J, 3, and Marie H, 1. Charles was born in Sweden and immigrated in 1877. He is a naturalized citizen. Maggie was born in Ohio and the children in Alabama. Living next door is Maggie's sister Sadie and her husband Edwin Lykes and their children.

Charles and his family remained in Alabama until 1916 when son Charles was born in Alabama. They were in Virginia in 1918 when son Herbert was born. In 1920 they were in Tennessee.

In 1920, Charles is living in Grundy County, Tennessee. He is 51, born in Sweden, and is a foreman for a coal mine. Living with Charles are his wife Maggie, 35, born in Ohio, her parents in Wales, and children Henry J, 13, Margaret, 7, Charles J Jr, 4 years & 8 months, and Herbert, 1 year and 3 months. All the children were born in Alabama, except Herbert who was born in Virginia. Charles' and Maggie's children John, Marie, and George are not living with them. It is not yet known where they were living in 1920. [2]

Today (early 21st century) southern Grundy County is home to the town of Monteagle, along Interstate 24, west of Chattanooga.

Charles and his family were back in Alabama by spring 1921 when son Paul was born.

In the 1930 Census, Charles is living at Flat Creek, Walker County, Alabama. He is 60 years old, born in Sweden, and the superintendent of a coal mine. Living with him are his wife Maggie, age 45 & born in Ohio, and seven of their children. The children are Marie, age 20, George, 18, Margurite, 16, Charles Jr, 13, Herbert, 11, Paul, 8, and Clifton, 6. All the children were born in Alabama except Herbert. Herbert's birthplace was illegible except it ended in "ia". The 1920 Census showed Herbert as born in Virginia.

Charles was bed-ridden for one month prior to his death. He had emphysema, and his doctor told him he would not get better. He committed suicide on Easter Sunday, 1936, shooting himself in the head. His son John found him. [5]

I remember Catharine Phillips Hager (wife of Henry Hager) telling me that she, Henry, and daughter Jane went to Flat Creek for Easter 1936. Henry had been sick that winter so Catharine drove. The seats in the cars did not adjust back then, and being 8 months pregnant with Sara, the steering wheel rubbed against her abdomen the whole way. While almost everyone was out of the house either celebrating Easter or at an Easter egg hunt, Charles shot himself in the head in the bathroom. Henry was in the house at the time, since he was still recovering. [7]

Charles lived for several hours after he shot himself. He was conscious and continued to give orders like he always did. [6]

Charles wrote a suicide note before he shot himself:
My health is gone

I am out of work
So I will end it all I don't want to be a burden
Bell - undertaker
Private funeral - no flowers

Charles was still living in company housing at the Flat Creek mine when he died.
Based on his suicide note, he may have just been told by the company that they were letting him go.

In the 1930 Census, Anna H Moore is living in St Clair, St Clair County, Michigan, at 1318 Oakland Avenue. She is 39 and widowed. Anna was born in Alabama. Her parents were born in Wales. Living with her are her daughter Mary E, age 14, and her

stepson Francis R, age 20. Mary and Francis were both born in Michigan, and are attending school. Anna does not work.

Annie and daughter Mary visited her uncle Tom Herbert in Australia when they were on a round-the-world trip, probably when Mary was 18, about 1934. [3]

On 9 September 1933, Annie May Moore and daughter Mary Elizabeth Moore returned to the US in Los Angeles on the ship Mariposa. They left Sydney, NSW, Australia, on 23 August 1933. Annie was 45, born on 20 September 1890 in Brookside, Alabama. Mary Elizabeth was 17, born 6 December 1915 in Battle Creek, Michigan. They were living in St Clair. [5]

In August 1957 Annie hosted a family reunion and celebration of brother Gwylym's 81st birthday at her home in St Clair. In attendance were her daughter Mrs Floyd Gustafson, grandchildren Karin, Kevin, Karl and Keith, Gwyllyn Herbert from Lady Lake, Florida, and several relatives from Birmingham, Alabama. [6]

Annie M Moore was born 20 September 1890 and died 22 December 1981 in St Clair, St. Clair County, Michigan. Annie was also living in Saint Clair at the time of her death. [1,2]

Notes for REUBEN RICE MOORE:

Charles F. (Rueben's father) and Franklin Moore, Justin Whiting, and Mark Hopkins founded the St. Clair Rock Salt Company in 1866, and eventually turned a profit. When a unique production method (the Alberger process) resulted in exceptionally high purity levels, they changed the name to Diamond Crystal Salt Company. The company prospered under Charles Moore's leadership. General Foods bought Diamond Crystal in 1929; however the Moore family bought it back in 1953. Diamond remained independent until 1987 when Akzo Nobel purchased it. Ten years later Cargill acquired the company. [1]

Reuben first married Olive Parmalee. She died of diphtheria. [4] Olive Parmelee Moore was born in 1872 and died in 1898. She is buried in Hillside Cemetery. [2]

In 1900, Reuben Moore is living on Brown Street in St Clair, St Clair Co, Michigan, with his parents Charles and Hattie Moore, and two sisters and brother. Reuben is 32, born in May 1868. No occupation was listed for Reuben, but he is probably working for his father. Charles and Hattie were born in Michigan. Charles' parents were born in New Hampshire, and Hattie's in Massachusetts and New York.

He married Elta May Cohoe on 26 Nov 1907. Their son Francis Raymond "Ray" Moore was born 14 August 1909. He was one week old when his mother died of child-

bed fever. [4] Elta May Cohoe Moore was born in 1883 and died in 1909. She is buried at Hillside Cemetery. [2]

In the 1910 Census, Reuben R Moore is living on Oakland Ave in St Clair, St Clair Co, Michigan. He is 40 years old and widowed, probably recently. Reuben is a manager at a Salt Block. He was born in Michigan, as were his parents. Living with him is his son, Francis R. Francis's age was difficult to make out on the census, but he may have been just one month old [should be one year old]. Living with them are Delia J Caboe [Cohoe], age 54, widowed, and Reuben's mother-in-law, and Ophelia Sheldon, age 52, single, and a boarder. Both Delia and Ophelia were born in Canada and immigrated in 1862, and are probably sisters.

Near Reuben on the 1910 Census, are Charles T Moore, his wife Harriet, and daughter Mary. Charles is the President of a Salt Block. They are Reuben's parents. Charles' parents were from New Hampshire, and Harriet's parents from Maryland and NY. These Moores continue to live on Oakland Ave, near Reuben & Annie.

In 1920, Reuben is on Oakland Ave in St Clair. He is 52 years old, and a manufacturer of salt. Living with him is his wife Anna May, 29, his son Francis (although Francis's name was unclear on the census), 10, and daughter Mary Elizabeth. Mary's age was not clear. Anna May was born in Alabama, and her parents in Wales.

Reuben died on 22 August 1922 while on a family vacation on the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. He reportedly collapsed and died on the tennis court. [4] Reuben R Moore, son of Charles & Harriet, 1868 - 1922, is buried in Hillside Cemetery, St. Clair, Michigan. [2]

There is some indication Reuben may have died on 26 August. It is possible he died on the 22nd, and the death certificate was not issued until the 26th when his body reached Cheboygan, Michigan, from the Upper Peninsula. [2, 3] Cheboygan is located on Lake Huron on the northern edge of the Lower Peninsula of Michigan.

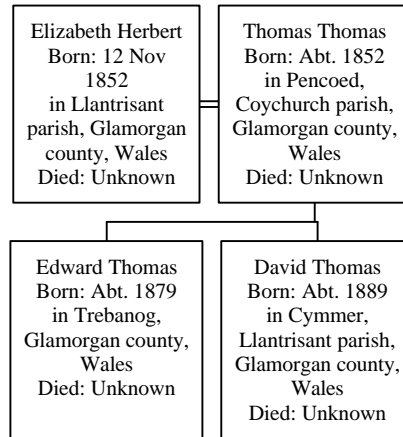

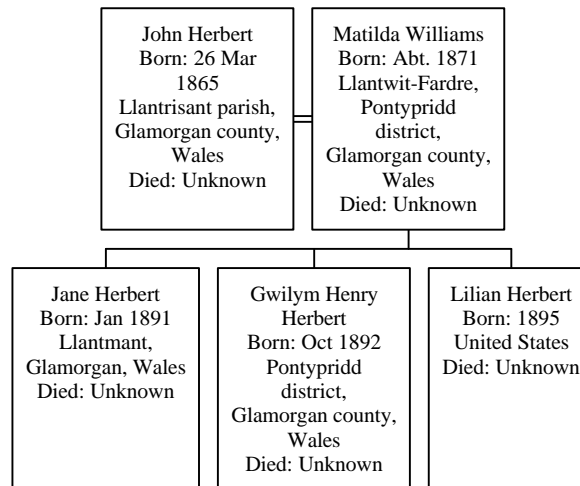

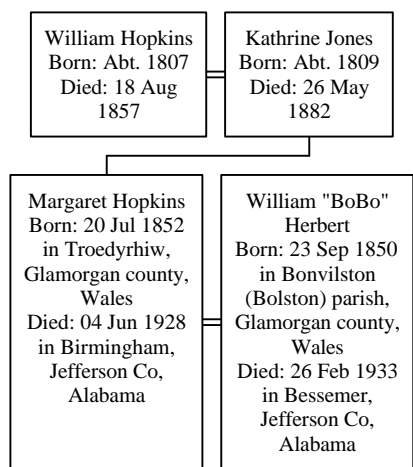

Notes for MARGARET HOPKINS:

The names of Margaret's parents, William Hopkins and Kathrine Jones, were provided by her husband William Herbert on her death certificate.

Margaret Hopkins was born in Troedyrhiw. [2] Toedyrhiw is in the Merthyr district, Glamorgan county.

Margaret got mad at her mother and left home at age 17. She set up a sewing group to earn her living. [4]

She is supposed to have sung at Buckingham Palace for Queen Victoria. [3]

Margaret was about four months pregnant with son David when the family immigrated in April 1880. He was born that September and died three months later.

Margaret died at Baptist Hospital in Birmingham, Alabama, June 4 1928. She had been attended by her physician since January. Margaret had cancer of the stomach which had metastasized into the liver. She was operated on June 4th, and must have died in surgery, as her time of death was 9:10 AM. A partial autopsy was performed. [1]

Notes for WILLIAM HERBERT:

The names of William's parents David Herbert and Jane (last name unknown) were provided by G. Herbert (Gwylym) on William's death certificate. Jane Gibbon's name was found in Willam Herbert's diary from 1886-1887.

William reported his birth in Trebanogbyonmer. [9] This may be the village of Trebanog, today in the Rhondda-Cynon-Taff district in Glamorgan county. Trebanog is close to Porth, and not too far from Pontypridd.

William may be the William Herbert born in the 4th quarter (Oct - Dec) 1850 in Bridgend district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [8]

A wedding announcement for one of the Herberts reported that William and Margaret emigrated from Porth Rhonda, Wales. [2]

On 2 Apr 1880, William & Margaret's church the Welsh Independent Chapel in Porth presented them with a bible on the occasion of their immigration to the US. [5]

The Herberts probably arrived in New York on 19 April 1880 on the ship Celtic from Liverpool. Listed on the passenger list is Wm Herbert, laborer, Mrs Herbert, wife, and Willie, age 3. They are shown on the passenger list as English. Several pages into the list is Wm Hurbert/Herbert, male infant. Several infants were listed on this page independent of their families. This infant is probably Sadie, who was 2 in April 1880, and is listed under her father's name instead of her own. [7]

The Herbert's came to Ohio when they first immigrated to the U.S. in 1880. Gwylym and Sadie (Sarah) were both born in Wales.

The 1880 Census (15 June 1880) William Herbert is living in the village of Bridgeport, Pease township, Belmont County, Ohio. He is 30 years old, a coal miner and born in Wales. Living with him are his wife Margaret, 27, and children William [Gwylym], 3, and Sarah J, 2. All were born in Wales. William and Margaret are sharing a house (same dwelling number on the census) with Thomas Harris and his family. Thomas is also a coal miner and was born in Wales. His children (ages 7 to 2 months) were born in Ohio.

Bridgeport and Martins Ferry (where it is sometimes reported that daughter Maggie was born) are in Belmont County, Ohio, on the Ohio River, across from the narrow, northwest tip of West Virginia. Continuing due east is Pennsylvania.

William began a diary in Welsh on 28 November 1886 in Bridgeport, Belmont County, Ohio, and ended it two months later on 28 January 1887. [10]

The Herberts moved to Alabama from Ohio between 1887 (when William's diary ends) and 1890 (when he appears in the Birmingham city directory).

In 1890 Wm Herbert is living at 1 street avenue, N [North?] in Birmingham, Alabama. William is a superintendent of coal mines working for Brookside. [3] Brookside Coal mine was opened in 1886 by the Coalburg Coal and Coke Company. It was purchased one year later by the Sloss Iron and Steel Company as a source of fuel for their blast furnaces in Birmingham. Brookside served as the headquarters for four Sloss-owned mines in the immediate area (Cardiff, Coalburg, Brazil and Brookside). [4]

In 1895 William Herbert is a manager for Paint Rock Coal Mines. He is living in Birmingham at Underwood ave and 10th st in the East Lake area of Birmingham. He lived on Underwood ave until 1898 or 99. In 1897 William is working for the Thomas Coal Co. In 1897 he is a superintendent for Little Warrior Mines. [6]

In 1898 William Herbert succeeded L W Jones as superintendent of the mines at Belle Ellen [Bibb County, Alabama]. William was at one time superintendent at Brookside, but of [late ?] years has been living in Arkansas. [11] The report of William living in Arkansas, presumably the state, is not supported by the available information in the Birmingham City directories. [CAR]

In the 1900 Census, William is living in Kingdom township, Bibb County, Alabama. He is 50 years old, born in Wales, and a superintendent at the coal mine, probably the Belle Ellen mine. His wife Margaret is 47 and was also born in Wales. William and Margaret have been married 24 years. They immigrated in 1880. Margaret has had 7 children, 6 are living. Living with them are their daughters Elisabeth, 18, Maggie, 15, Annie M, 9, and Mabel G (or S), 7. Elisabeth and Maggie were born in Ohio; Annie and Mabel in Alabama. Living with them are two boarders Robert and Marion Hopkins, and a black servant Edward Parker. Living nearby, on the next census page, is Charles Hager and his mother Marie. Charles Hager and Maggie Herbert married in Bibb County in 1902.

In 1902 William Herbert is a superintendent for the Bessemer Land & Imp [Improvement] Company. He is living in Lopez, (Bibb County) Alabama. [6]

In 1903 William, superintendent of the Bessemer Land Improvement Company's mines in Bibb County, testified before the Board of Arbitration to settle differences between the Alabama miners and coal operators. [12]

William & Margaret moved to Bessemer about 1904. [1]

In 1907 William is a mine operator with his address in Birmingham listed as 1012 First National Bank building. He is living in Bessemer. [6]

In the 1910 Census, William is living in Bessemer, Alabama, at 721 17th Street. He is 56 years old, born in Wales, and immigrated in 1879. William is a naturalized citizen. Living with him are his wife Margaret, 55, of Wales, and daughters, Lizzie, 25, born in Ohio, Annie M, 19, born in Alabama, and Mabel, 18, born in Alabama. William and Margaret have been married for 34 years. Margaret has born 7 children, 6 are still living. William is an operator in the mines. Son Gwylym is living around the corner and on the next census page with his wife and son.

Between 1910 and 1920 William and Margaret built the house at 1530 6th Avenue in Bessemer, where they remained for the rest of their lives. After their deaths daughters Gia and Mabel lived in the house. It was still standing in 2005.

In the 1920 Census, William is living in Bessemer, at 1530 Sixth Avenue. He is 69 years old and working at a mine. His exact occupation is unclear. Living with him are his wife Margaret, daughter Elizabeth, and son-in-law and daughter Albert H and Mabel Smith.

In the 1930 Census, William and his daughter Elizabeth are living in Bessemer, Alabama, at 1530 Sixth Avenue. William is 79 years old, born in Wales. He is retired (his occupation is "none"). His native language is Welsh. He came to the United States in 1880. It was unclear on the Census if he was naturalized. Living next door are daughter Mabel, with her husband Albert Smith and their daughter Elizabeth.

William's obituary called him one of the industrial leaders of Bessemer area.

William died at home on February 26, 1933. He was a retired superintendent of the coal mines. He had been sick and attended by his physician since January 15. His cause of death was arterio-sclerosis (or hardening of the arteries) and cerebral apoplexy (a stroke). He also had pneumonia when he died. [1]

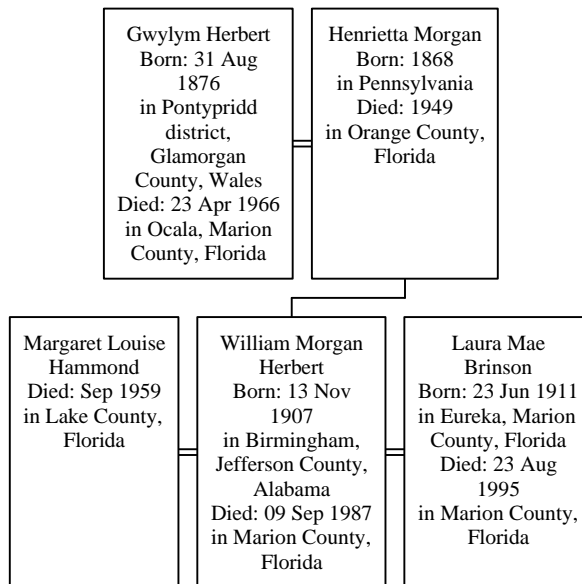

1. GWYLYM³ HERBERT (*WILLIAM*², *DAVID*¹) was born 31 Aug 1876 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan County, Wales^{1,2}, and died 23 Apr 1966 in Ocala, Marion County, Florida^{3,4,5,6,7}. He married HENRIETTA MORGAN⁸ 08 Mar 1906 in Bessemer, Jefferson County, Alabama⁹. She was born 1868 in Pennsylvania^{10,11}, and died 1949 in Orange County, Florida^{12,13}.

Notes for GWYLYM HERBERT:

Gwylim [Gwylm] Herbert's birth was registered in the quarter ending September 1876 in Pontypridd district, Glamorgan county, Wales. [1]

In 1895 William [should be Gwylm] Herbert is a student living in Birmingham, Alabama, with his parents at Underwood ave & 10th st in the East Lake area. [5]

From 1897 to 1900 Gwylm Herbert is a librarian at the Birmingham Public Library. He resides at Underwood ave in East Lake until 1899. In 1900 he is living at 606 N 21st. [5]

In 1900, Gwylm is probably the William Herbert living with his sister Sarah and her husband Edwin Lykes (Edward on the census) in Birmingham, Jefferson Co, Alabama. The census taker records William's birthdate as May 1874 (should be Aug 1876) and his birthplace as Georgia (should be Wales). William appears to be a clerk in a shoe store. (The census taker has all the birthdates in the Lykes house incorrect according to my records, so it is likely that this is Gwylm - CAR 10/2004.)

In 1901 & 1902 Gwylm Herbert is secretary & treasurer for Bondurant Lloyd Company in Birmingham. In 1901, Gwylm is living at 1717 7th ave in Birmingham; in 1902 he is living in Bessemer. [5]

In the 1910 Census, Gwylm is living at 612 16th Street in Bessemer, Jefferson Co, Alabama. His parents and three sisters are living around the corner, and on the previous census page. Gwylm is 34, and was born in England (should be Wales). He is a baker. Living with him are his wife Etta M, 38, and son William, 2. Etta was born in Pennsylvania and her parents in Wales. William was born in Alabama. Gwylm and Henrietta have been married 4 years.

On Sept 12, 1918, Gwylm Herbert registered for the WWI military draft. He was living in Lady Lake, Lake Co, Florida. Herbert was 42 years old, born on August 31, 1876, and a naturalized citizen. He was a farmer. His wife Henrietta Morgan[?] Herbert was listed as his next of kin.

In the 1920 Census, Gwylm (Goodwin Herbert on the Census) is living in Lady Lake, Lake Co., Florida. He is 44 years old, and was born in Wales. He immigrated to the US in 1879, and is a naturalized citizen, possibly in 1896. Gwylm is a farmer. (The industry is listed as manager? Maybe he was a manager on a farm.) Living with him are his wife Henrietta, 50, born in Pennsylvania, and son William, 12, born in Alabama.

In the 1930 Census, Gwylm (Gillian Herbert on the Census) is living in Birmingham, Alabama, on 6th Avenue South. He is 54 years old, born in Wales. He is a secretary for a church. Living with him are his wife Henrietta N, age 52, and their son William M, age 22. William is in school. They are living in a house also occupied by Charles & Carrie Reynolds, perhaps a subdivided house.

The obituary for Gwylm's father William (1933) lists his residence as Birmingham. The obituary for

his sister Sadie (1959), lists Gwylym's residence as Lady Lake, Florida.

By 1949, Gwylym was living in Florida when his wife Henrietta died in Orange County.

In addition to farming, Gwylym was also the post master at Lady Lake. [6]

Gwylym Herbert was living in Lady Lake, Florida, when he died in an Ocala hospital. Gwylym was a native of Pontytridd [sic] Wales, a graduate of Howard College, secretary of 56th Street Baptist Church for several years and once owned a bakery in Bessemer. He also helped organize the Southern Baptist BYPU. [4]

Gwylym Herbert was born August 31, 1876, and died April 1966 in Marion County, Florida. [2, 3]

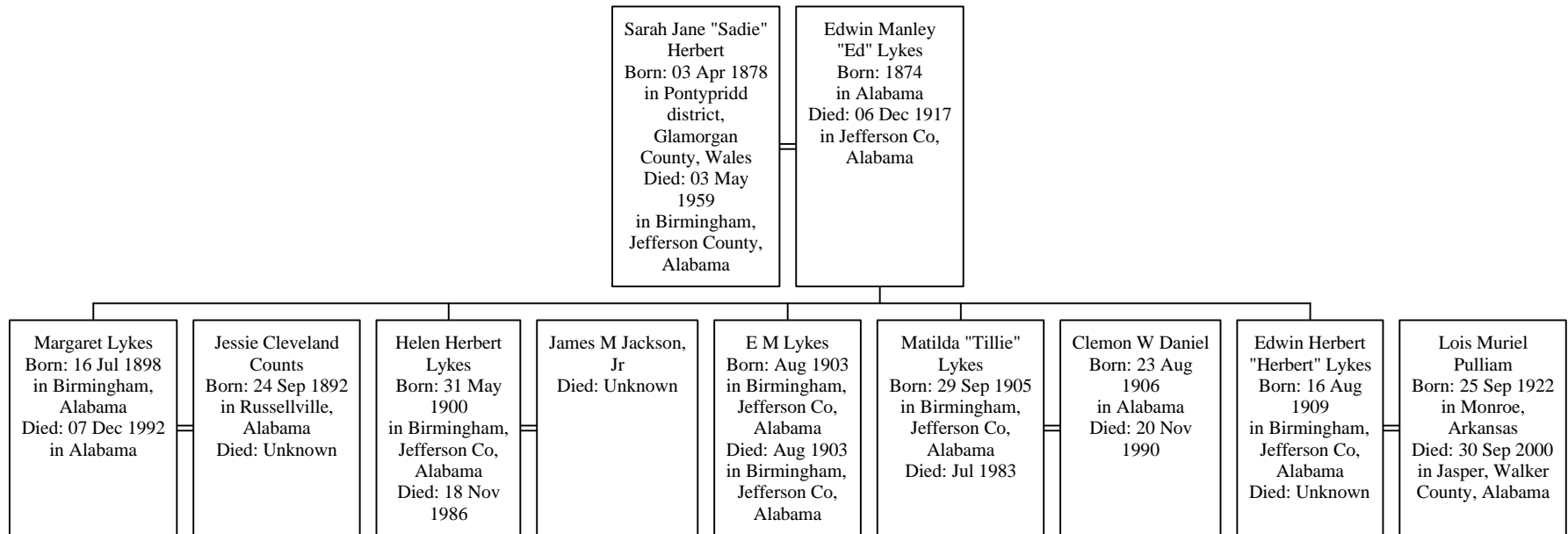

After the death of Edwin in 1917, Sadie started making sandwiches that she carried down to the elementary school down the street to sell to support herself and her children. When Woodlawn high school opened, she ran the cafeteria. [3]

In the 1920 Census, Mrs Edwin Lykes (Edwin M Lyker on Ancestry.com's index) is living at 319(?) 50th Street in Birmingham, Alabama. She is 41 years old and widowed. Sadie was born in Alabama and her parents in Wales. She is not working. Living with her are her children Margaret, 21, Helen, 19, Matilda, 14, and Herbert, 10. Margaret & Helen appear to be both working as stenographers for the rail road.

In 1930, Sarah J Lykes is living in Birmingham, Alabama, at 829 50th Street North. She is 52 years old and widowed. Sarah is a dietitian at a public school. Her and her parents' birthplaces are listed as England, but the language she spoke before coming to the United States was Welsh. Living with her are her daughter Matilda N, son Herbert, and James C Carter, a boarder. Matilda is 23 years old, and a teacher in the public school. Herbert is 20 and is not working. [1]

An undated newspaper clipping in the Lykes file at Oak Hill Cemetery reports that Mrs. Sadie Lykes, known as "Mother Lykes", was recovering from severe bruises suffered in a fall at the dining hall of Camp Winnetaska near Pell City where she was dietitian. She stumbled while carrying a tray and was knocked unconscious by the fall.

Before her retirement in 1954, Sadie was a dietitian at Woodlawn High School during the school term and at Camp Winnetaska during the summers. She taught a Sunday school class at West Woodlawn Baptist Church for 50 years. [obituary]

At her death, Sadie was survived by her son Herbert Edwin Lykes, and three daughters Mrs. J. C. Counts, Mrs. James M. Jackson, Jr., and Mrs. O. W. Daniel, all of Birmingham. She was also survived by her brother and four sisters. [obituary]

Also in the house is William Herbert, a boarder, and Mary Reid, a black servant. The census taker recorded William as born in Georgia in 1874. William is most likely Sarah's brother Gwylm, born 1876 in Wales.

In 1905 Edwin is still clerking for T C King and living in the Velma Station area. In 1907 Edward M Lykes and wife Sadie are living at 701 50th in Woodlawn. Edwin is a salesman for T C King. In 1908 Edward M Lykes is a tailor working for T M Jones, and living at 622 N 50th. [3]

On the 1910 Census, Edwin M Lykes is living on 50th Street North in Birmingham. He is 34 years old and was born in Alabama. He may be a salesman (the census was not clear). Living with him is his wife Sadie H, 31 (?), born in Wales. They have been married 13 years, and Sadie has had 5 children, 4 are living. Their children are Margaret, 11, Helen, 9, Matilda, 5, and E Herbert, less than 1 year. Living next door is Sadie's sister Margaret (Maggie) and her husband Charles Hager and their children.

Edwin died during the flu epidemic of 1917-1918. [1]

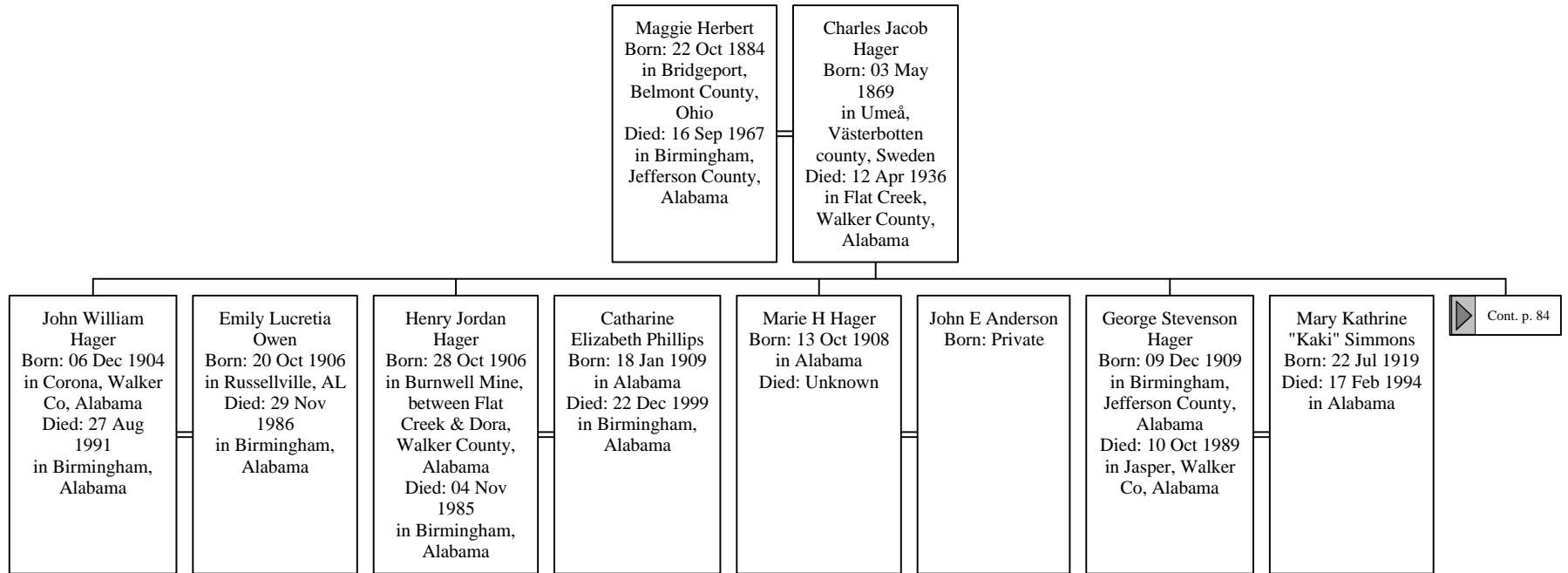

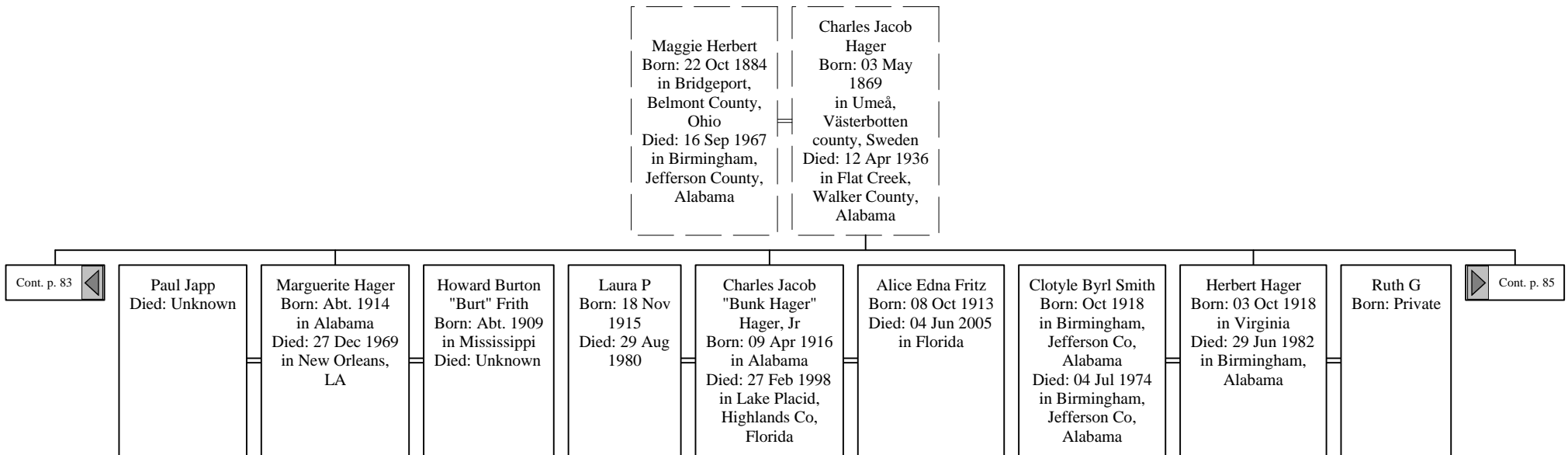

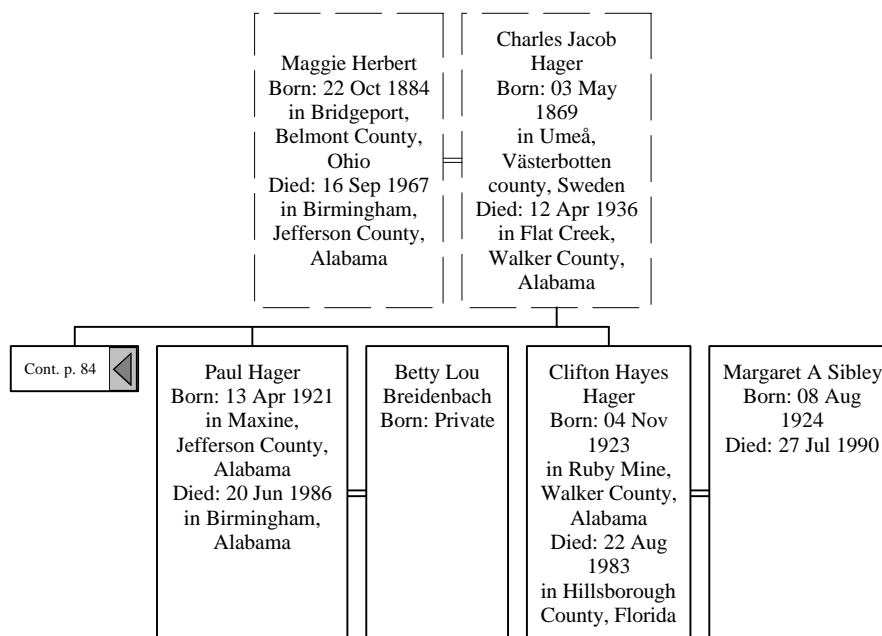

1. MAGGIE³ HERBERT (*WILLIAM*², *DAVID*¹) was born 22 Oct 1884 in Bridgeport, Belmont County, Ohio^{1,2}, and died 16 Sep 1967 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama. She married CHARLES JACOB HAGER³ 19 Nov 1902 in Belle Ellen mines, Bibb County, Alabama^{4,5}, son of JOHN HAGER and MARIE HOGLANDER. He was born 03 May 1869 in Umeå, Västerbotten county, Sweden⁶, and died 12 Apr 1936 in Flat Creek, Walker County, Alabama^{7,8}.

Notes for MAGGIE HERBERT:

Maggie was born at either Bridgeport or Martins Ferry, Ohio, both in Belmont County.

Margaret completed her education at Judson College, Marion, Alabama. [4]

When her husband Charles killed himself on Easter Sunday, 1936, Maggie's sister Mable and her family were visiting. When the shot inside the house was heard, Maggie said, "Oh no, he's done it." [5]

After Charles died in 1936, the oldest children, John, Henry, Marie, George, and Marguerite helped financially to support Maggie and their younger brothers. [1]

Maggie had long hair that reached to her fanny that she always wore in a bun. [5]

Great-niece remembered that she always had salt cellers on the table.

Maggie had breast cancer that had spread to her lung. The doctors operated but any other treatment she might have had is not remembered. [3] It was always said that Maggie lived 20 years after she was supposed to die, so that would mean she was diagnosed sometime in the late 1940's.

Maggie Hager was a native of Ohio and a member of the Hunter Street Baptist Church. Her last residence was at 1529 41st Street in Belview Heights, Birmingham. She was survived by her daughters Mrs John E Anderson of Lake Placid, Florida, and Mrs H B Frith of New Orleans, and her seven sons John W, Henry J, Charles J, and Paul of Birmingham, George S of Jasper, and Clifton H of Chattanooga, Tennessee. [2]

Notes for CHARLES JACOB HAGER:

Charles was born in Umea, Sweden, May 3, 1869, and was brought by his parents to this country a year later. [8]

He came to the United States from Sweden with his family in 1871 and settled in Alabama that year. [9]

Charles Hager spent his boyhood days at Decatur, Alabama, attending public schools there. He was graduated from high school in 1889 and during 1891 was a student in Smith's Business College, an affiliated institution of the University of Kentucky. After spending a year in the offices of the Louisville & Nashville Railway at Decatur, he entered the employ of the DeBardeleben Coal & Iron Co. at Bessemer. He remained with the same company when a year later it was taken over by the Tennessee Coal, Iron, & Railway Company and was in the service of that great industrial corporation until 1898, acting as yard master. Following that he was assistant superintendent of mines at Belle Ellen for Bessemer Coal, Iron & Land Company until 1904. For two years he was a mine superintendent in Kentucky, and his varied experience as a superintendent of coal mines has extended to many localities in Kentucky, Alabama, and Virginia.

In 1921 Mr. Hager became mine superintendent at Maxine, Alabama, for the Pratt Consolidated Coal Company. In 1924 the Pratt Company was absorbed by Alabama By-Products Corporation. In the meantime, in 1922 Mr. Hager had transferred to Cordova, where he has since practiced as a superintendent of the Ruby Mine, owned and operated by Alabama By-Products Corporation. This mine has a capacity of five hundred tons of bituminous coal a day, and there are one hundred and fifty employees at the Ruby Mine.

Mr. Hager is owner of farm and mineral lands on Shade Mountain in Jefferson County. His particular service to the government at the time of the World war was in speeding up coal production and for a period of nearly three years, he put in eighteen hours a day under the pressure of extraordinary responsibilities. He is a democrat, a member of the Presbyterian Church at Cordova, and in Masonry is affiliated with Blocton Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, Tuscaloosa Commandery No. 13 Knights Templar and Zamora Temple of the Mystic Shrine at Birmingham. He is a member of the Cordova Kiwanis Club. [8]

He was a pioneer in the coal mining industry in Alabama. With the exception of five years spent in Kentucky and Virginia his work has been confined to mining in Alabama. [9]

Charles' son, Henry, was a life-long employee of Alabama By-Products Corp. [7]

While a young man, Charles worked for a sawmill. Someone was stealing from the sawmill, so Charles was given the task to guard the mill at night and catch this thief. The thief returned, and Charles ended up killing him. Charles' mother Marie thought the best thing in this situation was for Charles to "return home to Sweden". Which he did for some time. [3] Charles left Göteborg (Gothenburg, Sweden) on 28 October 1892 for the United States. Charles arrived in New York City November 17, 1892, on the ship Ethiopia, sailing from Glasgow, with his mother Marie Hager. Charles is a citizen of the United States, born in Sweden, and his most recent residence was in Sweden. Charles is a lumber dealer. Marie's sister Fredericka Swenson (or Svensson) and her three young sons immigrated with them on that trip. [4, 10]

Tom Moxley's (Charles's future grandson-in-law) grandfather Moxley worked for Charles at Belle Ellen mine when the Moxley's first came to Alabama. [Tom Moxley]

When first wife Lillian died in January 1900, Charles was time keeper for the Bessemer Land and Improvement company at Belle Ellen. [11]

In the 1900 Census, Charles J Hager is living in Kingdom township, Bibb County, Alabama. He is 31, widowed, and born in Sweden. Charles is a post master. Living with him is his mother Marie Hager, 63. Charles and Marie immigrated in 1869. Also living with them is William (no last name listed), 17, a black house boy. Living nearby (on the previous census page) is William Herbert and his family. William's daughter Maggie and Charles would marry in 1902.

Charles and Maggie probably lived in Belle Ellen for a year after their marriage. Letters from William Herbert to Maggie and Charles in September and October 1903 indicate they moved out of state, passing through Chattanooga on their way. They may have moved to Kentucky as indicated in Charles' biography in the History of Alabama.

Charles was in Walker County, Alabama, in 1904 and 1906 when sons John and Henry were born.

At the time his mother Marie Hager died in Atlanta in Decemebr 1908, Charles is living at Belle Ellen in Bibb County, Alabama. [1]

In the 1910 Census, Charles is living in Birmingham, Alabama. He is 39 years old, and a manager at a coal mine. Living with him is his wife Maggie (looks like Mattie on the census), 25, and children John W, 5, Henry J, 3, and Marie H, 1. Charles was born in Sweden and immigrated in 1877. He is a naturalized citizen. Maggie was born in Ohio and the children in Alabama. Living next door is Maggie's sister Sadie and her husband Edwin Lykes and their children.

Charles and his family remained in Alabama until 1916 when son Charles was born in Alabama. They were in Virginia in 1918 when son Herbert was born. In 1920 they were in Tennessee.

In 1920, Charles is living in Grundy County, Tennessee. He is 51, born in Sweden, and is a foreman for a coal mine. Living with Charles are his wife Maggie, 35, born in Ohio, her parents in Wales, and children Henry J, 13, Margaret, 7, Charles J Jr, 4 years & 8 months, and Herbert, 1 year and 3 months. All the children were born in Alabama, except Herbert who was born in Virginia. Charles' and Maggie's children John, Marie, and George are not living with them. It is not yet known where they were living in 1920. [2]

Today (early 21st century) southern Grundy County is home to the town of Monteagle, along Interstate 24, west of Chattanooga.

Charles and his family were back in Alabama by spring 1921 when son Paul was born.

In the 1930 Census, Charles is living at Flat Creek, Walker County, Alabama. He is 60 years old, born in Sweden, and the superintendent of a coal mine. Living with him are his wife Maggie, age 45 & born in Ohio, and seven of their children. The children are Marie, age 20, George, 18, Margurite, 16, Charles Jr, 13, Herbert, 11, Paul, 8, and Clifton, 6. All the children were born in Alabama except Herbert. Herbert's birthplace was illegible except it ended in "ia". The 1920 Census showed Herbert as born in Virginia.

Charles was bed-ridden for one month prior to his death. He had emphysema, and his doctor told him he would not get better. He committed suicide on Easter Sunday, 1936, shooting himself in the head. His son John found him. [5]

I remember Catharine Phillips Hager (wife of Henry Hager) telling me that she, Henry, and daughter Jane went to Flat Creek for Easter 1936. Henry had been sick that winter so Catharine drove. The seats in the cars did not adjust back then, and being 8 months pregnant with Sara, the steering wheel rubbed against her abdomen the whole way. While almost everyone was out of the house either celebrating Easter or at an Easter egg hunt, Charles shot himself in the head in the bathroom. Henry was in the house at the time, since he was still recovering. [7]

Charles lived for several hours after he shot himself. He was conscious and continued to give orders like he always did. [6]

Charles wrote a suicide note before he shot himself:
My health is gone

I am out of work
So I will end it all I don't want to be a burden
Bell - undertaker
Private funeral - no flowers

Charles was still living in company housing at the Flat Creek mine when he died. Based on his suicide note, he may have just been told by the company that they were letting him go.

Notes for HERBERT HAGER:

Herbert liked to sail and had a boat in Washington, DC, during the war (WW II).

Herbert and Ruth spent their honeymoon at "the River", Herbert's brother Henry's cabin on the Warrior River. [1]

On August 2, 1962, Herbert and Sam Caldwell purchased 4 acres of land in St. Clair County, Alabama, fronting on the site of the, at the time, future Logan Martin reservoir. A few days later they opened a bank account for the "Birmingham Sailing Club", and at the end of the month the founding members met and formally organized the club. [2]

At the time of his death, Herbert was a member of the Clairmont Reform Baptist Church, and was living in Vestavia Hills, a Birmingham suburb. He was survived by his wife Mrs Ruth Hager, step-daughter Mrs Linda Mitchum of Carrollton, GA, sister Mrs Marie Anderson of Lake Placid, Florida, and six brothers. Brother Clifton was also living in Lake Placid. [3]

Henry was named for his uncle, Henry Jordan, his father Charles' sister Annie's husband.

When he was younger, Henry was known as Hank. As an adult most people called him Henry, but old friends still called him Hank. [3]

Henry attended 2nd and 3rd grades (1915-1916) at Ira Street School in Atlanta, Georgia, while living with his Aunt Annie Hager Jordan and Uncle Henry Jordan. Uncle Henry signed his report cards. Henry attended the second grade for the first 3 quarters, and was then promoted to the 3rd grade by examination (Apr 3 1916) and attended the 4th quarter of the 3rd grade. [report cards]

When he was young, Henry hoboed on a train from West Virginia to Atlanta, and came down with appendicitis on the way and almost died. His Aunt Annie Jordan lived in Atlanta, and took him to the doctor. [3]

In the 1930 Census, Henry Hager was living in Birmingham, Alabama, on Highland Avenue. He was 23 years old and an engineer, working in the mechanical industry. His roommate, or lodger on the census, was D. A. York (?), 36 years old and a physician.

Henry's first job after college was at American Cast Iron Pipe Co, in the drafting office, where future in-law Stephen Moxley (father of Henry's future son-in-law) was his boss. Stephen Moxley was later president of the company. Alabama By Products, the company Henry worked for most of his life, was a major supplier to ACIPCo. [3]

In addition to his B.S. degree in Mining Engineering from the University of Alabama, Henry also received a Masters from the University on a research scholarship with the US Bureau of Mines. [4]

The Mine Foreman Certificate of Competency that Henry received in 1939 is required in order to be an underground mine foreman in the coal industry. Underground mining is quite hazardous. [4]

Daughter Sara and son-in-law Tom Moxley struck up a conversation with a man they met while out to dinner in Birmingham. The man happened to have worked in coal mining. Sara said her father was Henry Hager. The man said that he had been a negotiator for the union and Henry was the fairest man he ever dealt with. [1]

Henry was instrumental in getting the Negro high school built in Walker or Jefferson county. They wanted to hang his picture in the high school. Henry did not want it there as he did not want everyone to know all he did to help other people. [2]

Grandmother and Granddaddy would occasionally drive up to Huntsville from Birmingham. Granddaddy would come in, say Hello, have a drink of whiskey, and stand around jingling the change and keys in his pockets. He had come, said hello, and now it was time to go. Grandmother, of course, needed to sit and visit for a while. [CAR]

Henry had scars on his lungs, probably from childhood T. B. (tuberculosis). He received further scarring on his lungs in the winter of 1936 from severe pneumonia. He smoked most of his life, usually in secret. [5] He died November 4, 1985, from complications after lung surgery. After surgery to remove part of his lung, a clot formed and/or broke loose and traveled to his lungs causing them to fill with fluid as if he had pneumonia. This was his second surgery to remove part of his lung. The first surgery was several years prior to the second.

Also in her class was William M Herbert, cousin of Catharine's future husband Henry Hager. [1]

Catharine taught school for a short while either before and/or after she married Henry. [Sara Moxley]

She was an excellent seamstress. Catherine could go into a store, find a dress she or her daughters liked, do a quick sketch on the street, and then go home and make the dress.

Listed as a survivor on her obituary was her sister-in-heart, Sarah Fleetwood Hendrix. She and Sarah met in the spring of 1914 when they were 5 years old, and remained lifelong and close friends. Sarah was known to all Catharine's children and grandchildren as Aunt Sarah.

When Catharine died, her daughter Sara had just bought her a nice nightgown and bed jacket for Christmas since Catharine was confined to bed. She was buried on Christmas Eve in her new nightgown.

During college (Auburn, AL), Cal owned and flew his own airplane, an Ercoupe.

In 1951 or 1952, Cal flew to Connecticut from Auburn through bad weather with no radio and was the only plane flying over NY. Coming back to Auburn, he developed trouble in Maryland (?). He was able to land but could not afford to fix the plane, and left it at the airport. [Jane Reuther]

During college at API Cal worked for Mr. Fortner at Jake's Joint and the Elk's Club. He met Jane at Jake's Joint. Mrs. Fortner gave Cal her recipe for Barbecue Sauce and Barbecue Basting Sauce that he used throughout his life to make fantastic barbecue chicken on the grill.

Cal graduated from Alabama Polytechnic Institute (API - later re-named Auburn University) in Auburn, Alabama, in 1953, with a Bachelors of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. His first job was across the country for Boeing in Seattle, Washington, working on the B-52 airplane. He left Boeing in 1956 for Westinghouse in Pittsburgh, PA, but was on his way back to Boeing and Seattle in 1958 when Jane was pregnant with Cathy. Just weeks after Cathy was born in September, they headed for a new assignment in Fort Walton Beach, FL, and the BOMARC missile program at Eglin AFB.

In 1963, Cal, Jane, Cathy and Russell moved to California where Cal worked on the Minuteman weapon system.

In April 1965, Cal, Jane and the children moved to Huntsville, Alabama, where Cal continued his work for Boeing, this time on the space program. He was responsible for the Boeing Saturn V Logistics Support Staff, developing a Logistics Support Plan. He was also responsible for Saturn V Logistics activities and program schedule. In 1967 he assumed responsibility for directing the preparation of the Saturn V Flight Manual, a single source reference prepared specifically for the astronauts' use.

When Boeing reduced their operations in Huntsville in 1974 (the summer President Richard Nixon resigned and the fall Cathy got her driver's license), Cal and Jane decided to stay in Huntsville rather than be transferred to another city, and Cal went to work for Sperry Corporation on tactical missile systems at MICOM. In 1980 he began a brief stint at Guest Associates providing marketing and technical representation for technically oriented customers, as well as consultation to small business through the Small Business Administration.

In 1982, Cal went back to work for Boeing on marketing management assignments for the Air Force, MSFC, MICOM, and SSDC customers. He retired early in 1993 after Jane's brain aneurysms and surgery that year.

Early in their marriage, when they were young and poor, Cal decided to start making furniture instead of buying it. He bought the appropriate tools and set up shop in the spare bedroom in their apartment. The first thing he made was a long low bench in the Danish Modern style. He made their bedroom furniture and later on a hi-fi cabinet, kitchen table, and a new dresser for Jane in the 1970's.

In 1983, when his mother Lydia was no longer making the family Christmas cookies, Cal took up the task, often with daughter Cathy's help. He made their favorites Springerli, Brownie Lebkuchen & Schwaben Brodli, and new ones as well. Just as Lydia did, he kept track of what he made and how many. In 2002, Cathy took up the tradition on her own. Cal also had a vegetable garden for many years, and took up canning at that time. Not only did he can vegetables, but he also made jellies and pickles.

In 1988 & 1989, Cal and Jane built a new, larger house on Mountain Springs Circle in Huntsville and moved in in April 1989. The house included a 3-car garage with large shop attached, and Jane's large

weaving room over the garage and shop. After Cal's death, the house was sold to Hank and Kathy Perkins, friends from church, and a school friend (Hank) of daughter Cathy's when growing up.

Cal entered Huntsville Hospital November 25, 1999 (Thanksgiving Day) for heart bypass surgery on November 26. The surgery was successful, but numerous complications ensued due to Cal's emphysema and the steroids he had been taking for the emphysema that interfered with the healing process. After seven weeks in ICU, he passed away due to multiple organ system failure on January 14, 2000, at 5:05 PM. Daughter Cathy, son Russell, future son-in-law Bryan Kennedy, and Dr. T. Benton Washburn were present. He was buried January 18, 2000 at Maple Hill Cemetery in Huntsville.

Unknown to his family until after he entered the hospital, Cal had been having heart problems for some time. Nitroglycerin pills were found in his study for heart pain. Cal left a folder of instructions for his daughter Cathy just prior to entering the hospital in case he passed away. The information and instructions included the notice of his death to be published in the newspaper. Cathy used this almost as he had written it.

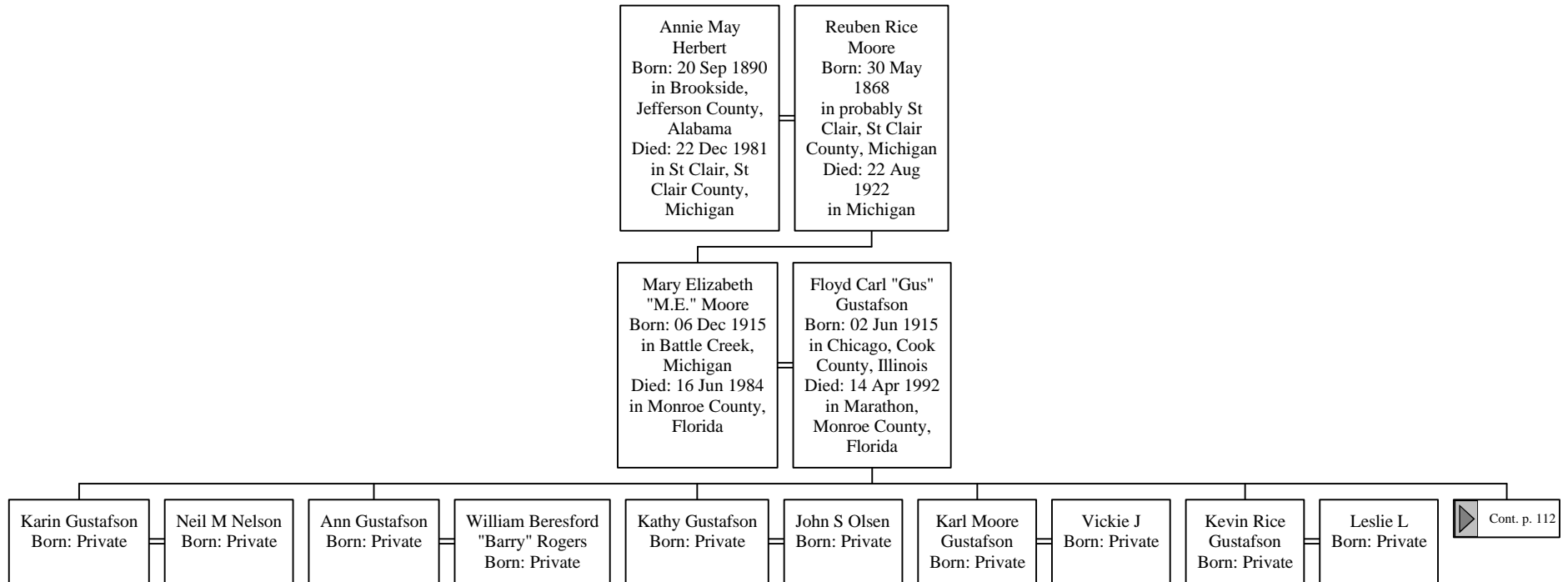

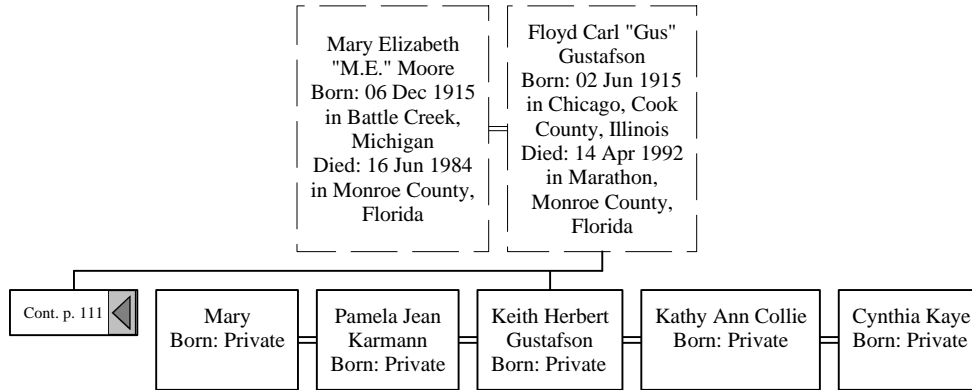

In the 1930 Census, Anna H Moore is living in St Clair, St Clair County, Michigan, at 1318 Oakland Avenue. She is 39 and widowed. Anna was born in Alabama. Her parents were born in Wales. Living with her are her daughter Mary E, age 14, and her stepson Francis R, age 20. Mary and Francis were both born in Michigan, and are attending school. Anna does not work.

Annie and daughter Mary visited her uncle Tom Herbert in Australia when they were on a round-the-world trip, probably when Mary was 18, about 1934. [3]

On 9 September 1933, Annie May Moore and daughter Mary Elizabeth Moore returned to the US in Los Angeles on the ship Mariposa. They left Sydney, NSW, Australia, on 23 August 1933. Annie was 45, born on 20 September 1890 in Brookside, Alabama. Mary Elizabeth was 17, born 6 December 1915 in Battle Creek, Michigan. They were living in St Clair. [5]

In August 1957 Annie hosted a family reunion and celebration of brother Gwylm's 81st birthday at her home in St Clair. In attendance were her daughter Mrs Floyd Gustafson, grandchildren Karin, Kevin, Karl and Keith, Gwylm Herbert from Lady Lake, Florida, and several relatives from Birmingham, Alabama. [6]

Annie M Moore was born 20 September 1890 and died 22 December 1981 in St Clair, St. Clair County, Michigan. Annie was also living in Saint Clair at the time of her death. [1,2]

Notes for REUBEN RICE MOORE:

Charles F. (Reuben's father) and Franklin Moore, Justin Whiting, and Mark Hopkins founded the St.

Clair Rock Salt Company in 1866, and eventually turned a profit. When a unique production method (the Alberger process) resulted in exceptionally high purity levels, they changed the name to Diamond Crystal Salt Company. The company prospered under Charles Moore's leadership. General Foods bought Diamond Crystal in 1929; however the Moore family bought it back in 1953. Diamond remained independent until 1987 when Akzo Nobel purchased it. Ten years later Cargill acquired the company. [1]

Reuben first married Olive Parmalee. She died of diphtheria. [4] Olive Parmelee Moore was born in 1872 and died in 1898. She is buried in Hillside Cemetery. [2]

In 1900, Reuben Moore is living on Brown Street in St Clair, St Clair Co, Michigan, with his parents Charles and Hattie Moore, and two sisters and brother. Reuben is 32, born in May 1868. No occupation was listed for Reuben, but he is probably working for his father. Charles and Hattie were born in Michigan. Charles' parents were born in New Hampshire, and Hattie's in Massachusetts and New York.

He married Elta May Cohoe on 26 Nov 1907. Their son Francis Raymond "Ray" Moore was born 14 August 1909. He was one week old when his mother died of child-bed fever. [4] Elta May Cohoe Moore was born in 1883 and died in 1909. She is buried at Hillside Cemetery. [2]

In the 1910 Census, Reuben R Moore is living on Oakland Ave in St Clair, St Clair Co, Michigan. He is 40 years old and widowed, probably recently. Reuben is a manager at a Salt Block. He was born in Michigan, as were his parents. Living with him is his son, Francis R. Francis's age was difficult to make out on the census, but he may have been just one month old [should be one year old]. Living with them are Delia J Caboe [Cohoe], age 54, widowed, and Reuben's mother-in-law, and Ophelia Sheldon, age 52, single, and a boarder. Both Delia and Ophelia were born in Canada and immigrated in 1862, and are probably sisters.

Near Reuben on the 1910 Census, are Charles T Moore, his wife Harriet, and daughter Mary. Charles is the President of a Salt Block. They are Reuben's parents. Charles' parents were from New Hampshire, and Harriet's parents from Maryland and NY. These Moores continue to live on Oakland Ave, near Reuben & Annie.

In 1920, Reuben is on Oakland Ave in St Clair. He is 52 years old, and a manufacturer of salt. Living with him is his wife Anna May, 29, his son Francis (although Francis's name was unclear on the census), 10, and daughter Mary Elizabeth. Mary's age was not clear. Anna May was born in Alabama, and her parents in Wales.

Reuben died on 22 August 1922 while on a family vacation on the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. He reportedly collapsed and died on the tennis court. [4] Reuben R Moore, son of Charles & Harriet, 1868 - 1922, is buried in Hillside Cemetery, St. Clair, Michigan. [2]

There is some indication Reuben may have died on 26 August. It is possible he died on the 22nd, and the death certificate was not issued until the 26th when his body reached Cheboygan, Michigan, from the Upper Peninsula. [2, 3] Cheboygan is located on Lake Huron on the northern edge of the Lower Peninsula of Michigan.

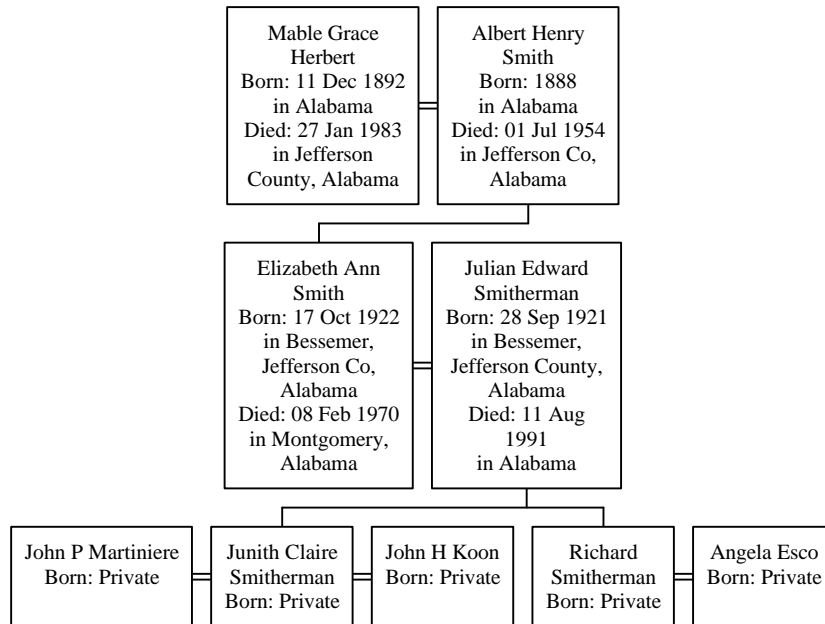
