Power of Attorney (POA) by siblings Henry Hallman, Anthony Hallman and Catherine (Hallman) Creasamore of Lincoln County, North Carolina, to Jacob Summey to receive their share of their father Henry Hallman's estate and of their brother Daniel Hallman's estate, both of Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.

Images of the will were provided by Richard Hallman. The POA is recorded in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, Mortgage Book 10, pages 225 & 226. The images are available from the Montgomery County Recorder of Deeds (www.montcopa.org). The Historical Society of Montgomery County, PA, provided images that were more legible than the ones available on-line from Montgomery County.

The transcription was done by Catherine Reuther in August 2020.

All effort was made to accurately transcribe the POA as written, maintaining the spelling and capitalization in the document. The "s" was particularly difficult, as it often appeared capitalized to our 21st Century eyes, but I believe it was usually lowercase.

## End transcription

The estate of brother Daniel Hallman was included in the settlement. Daniel died intestate in 1800 after his father Henry's will was written. As Henry Sr was likely sole heir, Daniel's estate was either not settled before his father's death, or the three North Carolina siblings felt the amount left to them in Henry's will should have been adjusted to include a share of Daniel's estate. Without an adjustment, Daniel's estate in effect passed to their younger half-siblings.
