1-**John Brooke**, son of **Humphrey Brooke II** and **Mary**, was born on 30 September 1638 in Yorkshire, England, died in 1699 in Elsinborough, New Jersey<sup>2</sup> at age 61, and was buried in Quarker Burial Ground At Newton Creek At West Collingswood, New Jersey.<sup>2</sup>

Noted events in his life were:

- Alt. Death: 1699, Newton Creek, Pennsylvania.<sup>3</sup>
- Alt. Burial: Quaker Cemetery, Haddonfield, New Jersey.<sup>3</sup>
- Emigration: 1699, Liverpool, England, On The Ship Britannia To Elsinborough, New Jersey.
- Residence: 29 September 1682, Hullock, Fulstone, In The Graveship Of Holme, Yorkshire, England.<sup>2</sup>
- Residence: 1698, Holmfirth, Yorkshire, England.<sup>2</sup>

John married **Frances Morton** about 1658 in England.<sup>3</sup> Frances was born about 1640 in England,<sup>1</sup> died in 1699 in Elsinborough, New Jersey<sup>2</sup> about age 59, and was buried in Quarker Burial Ground At Newton Creek At West Collingswood, New Jersey.<sup>2</sup> Other names for Frances were Frances Cockshaw,<sup>4</sup> Francis, and Francis Morton.<sup>5</sup> They had six children: **Jonathan, Abigail, Elizabeth, John, James**, and **Matthew**.

Marriage Notes: John and Frances set sail with 2 of their 6 children, James and Matthew, in the summer of 1699 on the ship Britannia from Liverpool, England for Pennsylvannia, the colony of fellow Quaker and countryman, William Penn. During the disasterous voyage, 50 people were buried at sea. Many of the 150 survivors were sick and weak. They were not allowed to land in Pennsylvania due to the infectious disease. The Brookes left the ship at Elsinborough, New Jersey, and found shelter at the home of William Cooper. John and Frances died shortly thereafter and were buried at the Quaker burial ground at Newton Creek at West Collingswood.

Before leaving England, John Brooke and Thomas Musgrave of Halifax had purchased 1500 acres in Pennsylvania from William Penn. After their parents' deaths and after much red tape, James and Matthew obtained the title to 750 acres. The deed was signed by Wiliam Penn August 20, 1701.

James and Matthew's 750 acres lay in Limerick Township which became part of Montgomery County September 10, 1784. It lay in the central part of Limerick Township to the northwest of Limerick Square.

John and Francis had five known children - Jonathan, Abigail, and Elizabeth remained in England when their parents immigrated. [Elaine Jeter]

General Notes: According to Bob Brooke, a direct Brooke descendant, Francis' maiden name was believed to be Morton. [1]

Phillips Lovering Morrison, a descendant of John & Frances, reports that John Brookes' wife was Frances Cockshaw. His information is from the Limerick Historical Society. [2]

Mr. William Brooke Fetters (of Maryland) is writing a Brooke book. His church records (England) indicate a marriage between John Brooke and Frances Morton.

When I returned to the Limerick Historical Society to check records for Frances Cocksaw, the Cocksaw notes (2) were missing from the files. Really weird.

So, we are left with the Fetters' research, which shows Brooke/Morton record. This finding also agrees with Bob Brooke (Clovis, CA) research, to wit: Frances' maiden name was Morton.

James married **Sarah Goodacre**. Sarah died on an unknown date. Another name for Sarah was Unknown. They had eight children: **George, Jonathon, James, Sarah, Elizabeth, John, David**, and **Samuel**.

General Notes: James' wife's name was provided by a Brooke descendant Bob Brooke of Clovis, CA [Elaine Jeter 5/1998]

General Notes: According to Elaine Jeter, James (husband of Mary Evans, son of Jonathan b. 1701, grandson of James) was actually the James that was the son of James b. 1702, grandson of James. I have left my tree as I originally recorded it based on Lotta Reuther Longstreet's information.

According to Old Philadelphia Families, The North American, Phila, 1912, James Brooke and Mary Evans had the following children - Owen, Mary, Elizabeth, Benjamin, Barbabas, Jonathan, James, Hannah, Ann, Ruth, and Rachel. Eleven in all.

James married **Mary Evans**, daughter of **Owen Evans** and **Mary Davis**, on 8 October 1747.<sup>7</sup> Mary was born in 1724<sup>6</sup> and died on 2 February 1809<sup>6</sup> at age 85. They had 11 children: **Rachel, Jonathan, Owen, Mary, Elizabeth, Benjamin, Barnabas, James, Hannah, Ann**, and **Ruth**.

6-Rachel Brooke<sup>9</sup> was born on 2 April 1791 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania<sup>9</sup> and died on 25 December 1868 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania<sup>9</sup> at age 77.

General Notes: In a family scandal Rachel Brooke, daughter of Owen Brooke, eloped with Bernard McQuade, the family's indentured servant & coachman, and left Pennsylvania for Aurelius, Cayuga County, NY, where her sister and brother-in-law lived. They either ran away or were sent away. They purchased land there after making their way by Conestoga wagon up the Lackawanna Trail. There Bernard and Rachel had 6 children: Elizabeth, Annie D., John S., James P., and Hannah L. McQuade. There was one still unknown to us as there is some conflict of information as to whether the child was male or female.

In 1839 Rachel moved back to Philadelphia with her four children, Elizabeth and the unknown child died young. Rachel lived in the Roxborough and Manayunk areas.

Rachel married **Bernard McQuade**<sup>9</sup> about 1818. Bernard was born between 1774 and 1796 in Ireland<sup>9</sup> and died on 1 June 1830 in Probably Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York.<sup>9</sup> They had seven children: **Elizabeth, Annie D, John S, Elizabeth, Unknown, James P,** and **Hannah L**.

General Notes: Bernard McQuade entered the United States sometime before 1819, probably through the port of Philadelphia. He was an indentured servant and coachman to the Brooke family. (Brian McQuade)

It was thought at one time Bernard died in NY or moved out west, but

recent information shows a possibility of him also moving to the Philadelphia area. (BM)

7-**Elizabeth McQuade**<sup>9</sup> was born on 27 December 1819 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York<sup>9</sup> and died after 1819 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York.<sup>9</sup>

7-Annie D McQuade<sup>9</sup> was born on 27 April 1821 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York<sup>9</sup> and died on 25 January 1901 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania<sup>9</sup> at age 79.

Annie married **John Etter Yeager**. John was born in October 1824 in Pennsylvania and died on 13 November 1913 in Pennsylvania at age 89.

7-**John S McQuade**<sup>9</sup> was born on 23 February 1823 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York<sup>9</sup> and died on 22 December 1898 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania<sup>9</sup> at age 75.

John married **Lydia Butland**. <sup>9</sup> Lydia was born on 2 August 1825 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania <sup>9</sup> and died on 4 October 1906 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania <sup>9</sup> at age 81.

7-**Elizabeth McQuade**<sup>9</sup> was born on 6 June 1825 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York.<sup>9</sup>

7-**Unknown McQuade**<sup>9</sup> was born between 1825 and 1830 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York.<sup>9</sup>

7-**James P McQuade**<sup>9</sup> was born on 1 January 1828 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York<sup>9</sup> and died on 13 September 1868 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania<sup>9</sup> at age 40.

James married **Mary A Neale**. Mary was born about 1834 in Pennsylvania and died after 1880.

7-**Hannah L McQuade**<sup>9</sup> was born on 12 December 1830 in Aurelius, Cayuga County, New York<sup>9</sup> and died on 20 March 1915 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania<sup>9</sup> at age 84.

Hannah married **Frederick Vandegrift**. Frederick was born between 1819 and 1822 in Pennsylvania and died on 27 October 1878 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Hannah married Francis Lyle.9

6-Jonathan Brooke9 was born in 1795.9

Jonathan married Mary Asker.<sup>9</sup>

5-Mary Brooke<sup>6</sup> was born on 30 September  $1749^{10}$  and died on 25 October  $1828^{11}$  at age 79.

Noted events in her life were:

Alt. Birth: 1748.<sup>5</sup>
Alt. Death: 1823.<sup>5</sup>

Mary married **James Evans**,<sup>6</sup> son of **George Evans** and **Elizabeth Kendall**, on 16 January 1771 in St Pauls Episcopal Chruch, Philadelphia, PA.<sup>5</sup> James was born on 6 August 1748<sup>10</sup> and died on 16 January 1823<sup>11</sup> at age 74. They had two children: **Samuel** and **James**.

General Notes: Married Mary Brooke, his first cousin's daughter, on Jan. 16, 1771, in St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Philadelphia. Mary Brooke is dgtr. of Mary Evans, b.1724, and James Brooke, who was great-grandson of John & Frances Brooke, emigrants in 1698. --Lives of the Eminent Dead...Norristown, Pa. 1879. Father was George Evans (1702-1754); Mother was Elizabeth Kendall. [Elaine Jeter]

He fought in the American Revolution. (DAR records) [Elaine Jeter] The tax assessment for Limerick Twp for 1776 says he is a "joiner", and owns 170A of land. 1 horse, and 2 cows. [Elaine Jeter]

6-Samuel Evans<sup>12</sup> was born on 11 October 1771 and died on 10 July  $1825^{12}$  at age 53.

General Notes: Samuel Evans is implied as a son of James Evans and Mary (Brooke) Evans. His death on 10 July 1825 at age 53 yrs. 8 mo. 29 das. is part of an apparent bible transcription. [1]

6-**James Evans Jr**<sup>13</sup> was born on 9 March 1773 in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania<sup>14</sup> and died on 3 April 1842<sup>15</sup> at age 69.

General Notes: James Evans Jr. enlisted in the Pennsylvania militia 9/6/1814; discharged 1/4/1815. Ref: Pennsylvania Archives, v.7, p.471 [Elaine Jeter]

James Evans, Jr., was a Lieutenant-Colonel in the Pennsylavani Militia, and a member of the Pennsylvania Legislature. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

James married **Charlotte Brooke**, <sup>13</sup> daughter of **John Brooke** and **Elizabeth May**, on 24 December 1796. <sup>13</sup> Charlotte was born on 30 July 1776 <sup>15</sup> and died on 4 April 1841 <sup>15</sup> at age 64. They had eight children: **Anna**, **Thomas**, **Josiah W**, **Elizabeth**, **Owen Brooke**, **Harriett**.

5-**Elizabeth Brooke**<sup>5</sup> was born on 20 July 1751<sup>4</sup> and died on 25 January 1839<sup>4</sup> at age 87.

Elizabeth married **Samuel Brooke**,<sup>7</sup> son of **Samuel Brooke** and **Margaret Davis**, in 1776.<sup>7</sup> Samuel was born on 25 June 1752<sup>7</sup> and died on 31 December 1791<sup>7</sup> at age 39. They had one son: **John**.

General Notes: Samuel Brooke was a physician. He married his cousin, Elizabeth Brooke, daughter of James Brooke and Mary Evans, and granddaughter of Jonathan Brooke, elder brother of Dr. Brooke's father. They had a number of children, one of whom, John Brooke, operated a large marble quarry in Upper Merion. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

5-**Benjamin Brooke**<sup>5</sup> was born on 24 September 1753<sup>7</sup> and died on 22 July 1834<sup>7</sup> at age 80.

General Notes: "He was a man of considerable energy and force of character, and, at the outbreak of the Revolution, he ardently espoused the cause of the colonies, and although he had but recently married and established himself in a good business, he at once volunteered for military service in the field and was commissioned Lieutenant of a company of Foot in the Third Battalion of Associators of Philadelphia County, and leaving his bride of few months, marched with his command to Amboy, New Jersey. From that time until the close of the war, he was actively engaged in the patriotic struggle." [unidentified writer quoted in Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

He was commissioned March 1776, Lieutenant of the Third Battalion, and on May 12, 1777, Captain of the Sixth Battalion, Pennsylvania Militia. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

Benjaman and Anna made thier home at Gulph Mills, Upper Merion township. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

Benjamin married **Anna Davis**<sup>7</sup> on 25 April 1776.<sup>7</sup> Anna was born on 29 November 1754<sup>7</sup> and died on 7 September 1823<sup>7</sup> at age 68. They had six children: **David, Nathan, Mark, Rebecca, Jared,** and **Benjaman**.

General Notes: Anna was of Welsh ancestry. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

6-**David Brooke**<sup>7</sup> was born on 9 February 1777<sup>7</sup> and died on 1 May 1855<sup>7</sup> at age 78.

General Notes: David operated woolen mills on Gulf Creek and resided in the Colonial mansion of his father. David's sons Benjamin and Hunter were engaged in the manufacturing business with him.

David also has a daughter, Mrs. Thomas B. Smith, of Norristown, who lives in the old Brooke homestead of her grandparents, where they established

themselves upon their removal from Delaware County. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

David married **Hannah Jones**, <sup>7</sup> daughter of **Hugh Jones** and **Unknown**,. They had three children: **Benjamin, Hunter**, and **Nathan**.

Nathan married **Hannah Evans Brooke**,<sup>7</sup> daughter of **Owen Evans Brooke** and **Mary Brooke**,. They had one son: **D Owen**.

6-Nathan Brooke<sup>7</sup> was born on 8 February 1778<sup>7</sup> and died on 5 February 1815<sup>7</sup> at age 36.

General Notes: Nathan was "a farmer and prominent business man of Lower Merion" and a "well-to-do farmer, whose farm comprised the Valley of the Gulf Creek, in Radnor, adjoining Montgomery County." [unidentified writers in Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

Nathan married **Mary Jones**, <sup>7</sup> daughter of **Hugh Jones** and **Unknown**, on 11 October 1804. <sup>7</sup> Mary was born on 12 March 1786<sup>4</sup> and died on 19 April 1853<sup>4</sup> at age 67. They had five children: **Anna, Hugh Jones, Mark, Benjamin**, and **Mary**.

7-Anna Brooke<sup>4</sup> died on 26 July 1813.<sup>4</sup>

7-**Hugh Jones Brooke**<sup>7</sup> was born on 27 December 1805,<sup>7</sup> died on 19 December 1876<sup>7</sup> at age 70, and was buried in St. David's, Radnor, Pennsylvania.

General Notes: Hugh Jones Brooke was, for over half a century, identified with the affairs of Delaware County and the City of Phiadelphia as well. Although orphaned at the age of nice years, he overcame the obstacles of his early youth, and eventually attained an unusual degree of prominence among his contemporaries, both in commercial life and in public affairs.

In 1853 he purchased the farm in and adjoining Media, lying between the State raod and Ridley Creek, and removed thither frm Radnor. He was interested in numerous corporations, either as the originator or incorporator, among others, the Delaware Mutual Safety Insurance Company, the First National Bank of Media, the Twelth Street Market Company, and the Media Gas Company. He was also, for many years, the President of the Farmers' Market Company, Philadelphia. With his own means he built Chestnut Grove House in Media and Brooke Hall Female Seminary, and was cheifly responsible for the establishment of the Pennsylvania Training School for Feeble-Minded Children near Media.

He was almost continously called upon to serve his fellow-citizens in public life, both locally, and in the State at large, being sent to represent

Delaware County in both branches of the Pennsylvania Legislature. Regarding the Civil War, he was commissioned on August 20, 1861, a Captain in the Commissary Service, United States Volunteers, which post he held until July 16, 1863.

While living at Radnor he had been identified with old St. David's Protestant Episcopal Church. After removing to Media, he was mainly responsible for the establishment there of Christ Church. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

Hugh and Jemima had nine children, of whom only Hunter Brooke and Mrs. George M. Lewis of Media are survivors. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

Hugh married **Jemima Elizabeth Longmire**. They had four children: **Hunter, Nathan, Francis Mark**, and **Benjamin**.

7-**Mark Brooke**<sup>4</sup> was born on 29 November 1807<sup>4</sup> and died on 11 February 1878<sup>4</sup> at age 70.

Mark married **Sarah Trimble**<sup>4</sup> on 17 February 1836.<sup>4</sup> Sarah was born on 8 November 1814<sup>4</sup> and died on 11 December 1883<sup>4</sup> at age 69. They had six children: **Ester Willing, Jemina Elizabeth, Jugh Jones, Mary Emma, Lewis Trimble**, and **Adelaide L**.

7-**Benjamin Brooke**<sup>4</sup> was born on 10 April 1812<sup>4</sup> and died on 12 February 1880<sup>4</sup> at age 67.

7-Mary Brooke<sup>4</sup> was born in 1815<sup>4</sup> and died on 16 September 1819<sup>4</sup> at age 4.

6-Mark Brooke<sup>7</sup> was born on 9 December 1780<sup>7</sup> and died on 17 June 1808<sup>7</sup> at age 27.

Mark married someone. He had one daughter: Esther Willing.

#### 7-Esther Willing Brooke

Esther married **Major John Brooke**,<sup>7</sup> son of **Jesse Brooke** and **Elizabeth Yocum**, John was born on 22 February 1830 in Radnor, Pennsylvania<sup>7</sup> and died on 12 May 1902<sup>7</sup> at age 72. They had two children: **Mark** and **Benjamin**.

General Notes: John graduated from the Medical Department of the University of Pennsylvania in 1854. He was commissioned Assistant Surgeon, United States Army, November 22, 1862; Major and Surgeon, March 2, 1882. He retired February 22, 1894.

6-Rebecca Brooke<sup>7</sup> was born on 9 February 1784.<sup>7</sup>

Rebecca married **Reese Thomas**,<sup>7</sup> son of **William Thomas** and **Naomi Walker**, on 29 March 1810.<sup>7</sup> Reese was born on 24 March 1789<sup>7</sup> and died on 27 March 1835<sup>7</sup> at age 46. They had one son: **William Brooke**.

General Notes: Reese was a leading citizen of his section and one of the original antislavery men of Montgomery County. He was the proprietor of the famous Gulph Mills, which he operated until succeeded by his son, William Brooke Thomas, in 1832.

Reese and Rebecca had nine children.

7-William Brooke Thomas<sup>7</sup> was born on 25 May 1811<sup>7</sup> and died on 12 December 1887<sup>7</sup> at age 76.

General Notes: Although a native of Montgomery County, William moved to Philadelphia when still a young man, and was one of the City's most agressive, most progressive citizens.

7-James Barlow<sup>25</sup> was born on 7 October 1820 in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania,<sup>41</sup> died on 25 January 1881 in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania<sup>26</sup> at age 60, and was buried in St James Churchyard (Limerick Churchyard), Limerick, PA.<sup>39</sup>

General Notes: In the 1860 Census, James was a farmer [Elaine Jeter]

In the 1870 Census, James is living in Limerick Township, Montgomery Co, PA. He is 50 years old and a farmer. The value of his real estate is \$500 and his personal estate \$1200. James' wife Sophia, 44, is listed as the head of household, although the census taker placed the household number on the line above. Living with them are their children Elizabeth, 19, Richard, 17, Calvin, 15, Andrew, 12, and Brooke, 9. Also in the

house are James' mother Anna, 73, and his sister Charlotte, 35.

James married **Sophia Markley**, <sup>25</sup> daughter of **Andrew Markley** and **Elizabeth Stetler**, on 20 February 1848. <sup>24</sup> Sophia was born on 30 September 1822 in Pennsylvania, <sup>42</sup> died on 24 December 1903 in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania at age 81, and was buried in St James Churchyard (Limerick Churchyard), Limerick, PA. <sup>39</sup> They had six children: **Infant Daughter**, **Elizabeth Ann**, **Richard Markley**, **James Calvin**, **Andrew Markley**, and **Brooke Markley**.

7-**Mahlon Barlow**<sup>13</sup> was born on 10 November 1822 in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania,<sup>44</sup> died on 20 August 1863 in Pennsylvania,<sup>45</sup> at age 40, and was buried in St James Churchyard (Limerick Churchyard), Limerick, PA.<sup>3</sup>

General Notes: In the 1860 Census, Mahlon Barlow is living in Limerick township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania. He is 37, a farmer, and has a personal estate of \$250. Living with him are his wife Hannah, 31, children John, 11, Lydia A, 9, Owen, 7, Abraham, 5, Elizabeth B, 3, Anna, 1, mother Ann, 62, sister Charlotte, 25, John Kugler, 34, and wife Mary Kugler, 21, the Kugler's daughter Hannah, 1, and Franklin Kugler, 20.

[Mary Kugler was the daughter of Daniel Gilbert and Catharine Specht - CAR, Jul 2014 research with PA death certificates.]

"I do not know whether my grandpa had gone on an errand or to work, but on Aug. 20, 1863 when he did not return home, neighbors went in search of him. Evidently he fell ill & sat down under a tree to rest - there neighbors found his body.

On his tombstone is this inscription: "Mahlon Barlow lived in matrimony with Hannah Hallman 15 years and died Aug 20, 1863. Age 40 years, 9 months, 10 days" [1]

Hannah was born on 2 August 1828 in Limerick Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania,<sup>46</sup> died on 8 September 1903 in Phoenixville, Chester County, Pennsylvania<sup>47</sup> at age 75, and was buried in Morris Cemetery, Phoenixville, Chester County, Pennsylvania.<sup>24</sup> The cause of her death was Apoplexy. They had eight children: John Franklin, Lydia Ann, Owen Evans, Abraham, Elizabeth Bertha "Lizzie," Anna Ruberta, Mahlon H, and Alfred H.

General Notes: Cousin Elaine Jeter placed Hannah with these parents and siblings based on a Bible in possession of Craig and Karen Eiding (craige@ptd.net). Elaine dated her note 4/5/1999. It is not known where Lotta Reuther Longstreet obtained her information on Hannah's parents.

Hanna was widowed at age 35 with 8 children ranging in age from one month to 14 years [2].

In the 1870 Census, Hannah is living in Limerick Township, Montgomery Co, PA. She is 43 years old and living in the house of Catherine Miller, 62 (b. abt 1806), along with Joseph Miller, 28 (b. abt 1842), and Mary Miller, 63 (b. abt 1807). Living with Hannah is her son Alfred, age 6. Living next door is her son John and his wife Mary. Also nearby (same census page) are Hannah's brother Alfred Hallman, her late husband Mahlon's brother James and their mother Anna Barlow.

In the 1880 Census, Hannah is apparently the Hannah Hallman, 51 & widowed, in Limerick Township in the house of Joseph Miller, 38, the same household she was living at in 1870. Also in the house are Mary Miller, 83, Harriet Davis, 67, and Harriet's son Frank, 29, with Frank's wife Susie and their daughter Anne. Hannah is a housekeeper along with Harriet Davis.

In the 1900 Census, Hannah Barlow is living in Phoenixville, Chester Co, Pennsylvania. She is 71 years old (born Aug 1829) and widowed. Hannah has had 8 children and 6 are living. She is a housekeeper in the house of Joseph Miller, 58, a carpenter.

At this time, we do not have any information on who the Millers were that Hannah lived with after she was widowed, and whether they are related.

Hannah's great-granddaughter Mary Elizabeth Barlow thought her grandfather John Franklin Barlow's emigration to Iowa was at least partly because his wife (Mary Clemens) was unable to get along with his mother (Hannah Hallman Barlow.) She may be right, and perhaps John Franklin was not the only family member who had that problem... ??? [EJ]

Hannah Barlow, Hannah, age 75, widow, born in Montgomery County, died 1903/09/08 in Phoenixville of appoplexy. [1]

On March 12, 1836, he left home and went to work as Supt. of the lime works of James Hooven, near Norristown, after which he went into sales for the product in Philadelphia, and he thereafter became a partner with Mr. Hooven. Hooven sold his interest to Hugh Crawford; company then Crawford & Evans. After death of Crawford, Josiah W. Evans formed partnership with Owen Brooke Evans. [Elaine Jeter]

General Notes: Samuel Brooke was a physician. He married his cousin, Elizabeth Brooke, daughter of James Brooke and Mary Evans, and granddaughter of Jonathan Brooke, elder brother of Dr. Brooke's father. They had a number of children, one of whom, John Brooke, operated a large marble quarry in Upper Merion. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

2-Matthew Brooke<sup>2</sup> was born on 1 January 1680 in Yorkshire, England<sup>2</sup> and died in 1720 in Limerick, Montgomery Co, Pennsylvania<sup>2</sup> at age 40.

General Notes: Although Matthew died when only forty years of age, he seems to have been a leader among his neighbors in that section of Philadelphia County, as that is the county Limerick Township was then in. As early as March, 1709, we find his name to a petition for a public road. Both he and his brother, James Brooke, were appointed on the jury to lay out the road. In 1717, another petition was presented for a public road, from Oley to the King's highway. At the December Sessions the Court appointed Matthew and James Brooke and others viewers, and the road was laid out at forty feet wide, and duly confirmed at December Sessions, 1719. It is the direct road from Pleasantville, by way of Yellow House, to Amity.

In February, 1718, the County Commissioners appointed Matthew Brooke Collector of taxes for "Manatawney", then embracing a considerable extent of thinly-settled territory, out of which the township of Limerick was subsequently carved, about the time of Matthew's death in 1720. Matthew gave a section of his original purchase for a burial-place, measuring eighteen rods square, and containing two acres and four perches. It was located at the junction of two roads, one, extending from Germantown to a Swedish settlement at Douglasville, and the other, extending from this highway to the Schuylkil, at Royer's Ford.

Matthew's will was probated June 18, 1720.

General Notes: Ann is thought (unproven) to be the daughter of William Evans, (may not be Quaker) b. in Limerick Ireland, d. abt 1715; and his wife Ann <unknown>. (EJ)

William Evans: Immigrated to America with Welsh immigrants in 1698. Wife name was Ann. Purchased 700A. in Limerick Twp. (then Manatawny). William is cited as being the "Second Son" of John Evans and Ellen DeVerdon. First settled in Gwynedd while looking for land... Ship: Robert & Elizabeth; sailed from Liverpool April 18, 1698; stopped at Dublin, and on May 1, 1698, spread sails for the New World. 45 passengers died of dysentery. Arrival in Philadelphia, 17 July 1798. His will was probated in London, by Tobias Collett, Daniel Quare and Henry Gouldney.

When the War of Independence was precipitated in 1775, he volunteered his services on behalf of the struggling colonies. He was commissioned a Captain of the Sixth Battalion, Philadelphia County Militia, commanded by Colonel Frederick Antes in 1777-8, and by Colonel Peter Richards in 1779. In 1780 he was one of the Commissioners of Philadelphia County and under the Act of March 14, 1784, was

appointed one of the Commissioners for making the Schuylkil River navigable, and preserving the Fish therein. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

John had eleven children, six with his first wife - Jesse, Rachel, Robert, Charlotte, Thomas, and a second Charlotte; and five by his second wife - Mary, Sarah, Ann, John, and William. When the Revolutionary War broke out, Matthew manufactured arms and equipment for the Colonial forces. He sent several cannon to the Council of Safety including a twelve-pounder on July 27, 1776 and an eighteen-pounder on August 1, 1776. At the meeting of the Board of War on April 3, 1777, he was requested to secure a hundred wagons for the transportation of public stores.

About 1788 or 1790, he removed to Birdsboro, Berks County, and resided there until his death. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

After the war, Major Brooke maintained his interest in military affairs, and when a militia system was established in Pennsylvania, he aided in its development. At the beginning of the 19th century, he was Brigade Inspector, and later Brigadier General of part of the 3rd Division. He was particularlyactive during the war of 1812, when Pennsylvania was threatened with invasion by the British after the capture of Washington, D. C. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]

At the age of 22, with the advent of the Civil War, John recruited a company for three months' service, originally called the "Madison Guards". This was attached to Colonel Hartranft's 4th Regiment as Company C. John was commissioned Captain on April 20, 1861. Mustering out when his enlistment expired, John then began recruiting the 53rd Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers, of which he was commissioned Colonel, August 17, 1861.

Colonel Brooke participated in many of the most important battles of the War including Fair Oakes, Gaines' Mill, second battle of Bull Run, Antietam, Fredericksburg, Gettysburg, Cold Harbor, Wilderness, and others. The highest praise was accorded him for his conduct and achievements. After the battle of Spottsylvania Court House, John was commissioned

Brigadier General of Volunteers May 12, 1864, and then brevetted Major General in August 1864. Major General Brooke was 26 years old. John was wounded at Gettysburg, but did not leave the field. At Cold Harbor, he was struck in the side with grape shot, and for some time, his survival was in doubt.

After the War, in 1866, he was commissioned Lieutenant-Colonel in the regular army, rising to the rank of Major-General in 1897. For many years he was engaged in the campaigns against the Indians, and then participated in the campaign in Porto (sic) Rico in the Spanish American War and was appointed Governor General of that country. In December 1898, he became Governor General of Cuba.

He retired July 21, 1902, and resides at Rosemont. [Old Phila Families, The North American, Phila, 1912]
