I have known you by name for a long time. It was probably 15 years ago that you wrote to my Mother, Anna Barlow Reuther, asking for information about the Barlow family.

I am exceedingly anxious to secure all the data I can about our family tree. I regret so much that I did not get more information while Mother was living. I am also sorry that I am not near enough to you to call on you and see what material you have.

I realize it is a great task to copy geneo-logical records, for I have done a great deal of that for our State D.A.R.Society. So, I was wondering if it would be easier to send me your records by insured or registered mail. I will copy them and return them the same way. Of course, I will bear all the expense involved.

I do not know where your line and mine cross but if by chance we are both descendents from John Barlow 1790-1847 and his wife Anna Evans 1798-1871, I may have some data you do not have. I have been able to trace Anna Evans back 5 generations to John Brooke and his wife Frances who were born at Hagg, Yorkshire, England.

I see Harry Barlow ocassionally. He is living in Jacksonville. If you have a chance to come to Florida, please do not fail to come to Daytona Beach to visit us. I deem it a pleasure always to entertain a Barlow.

Dear Mrs Fry,

I am sorry that I have been so slow returning your book. I thank you indeed for the trouble you took to send it. I have forgotten the amount of postage that was on the package; but I presume it will cost the same on its return trip. So, when I mail the package on Monday morning I will <sup>ow</sup> close the same amount in stamps in this letter. I am also sending with the book a rough chart of my family tree. I made the copy for Mother's side only, knowing that it was only the Barlow side that would interest you.

On page 29 you started Mother's record- here is the information to complete it:- She died March 10, 1930 in Daytona Beach, Fla. Buried in Westminster Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pa. Married 7/25/87 to Henry C. Reuther who was born 3/17/1859, died 6/5/1932  
Children:-  
Edna Laura--born 1/24/1889  
Lotta Barlow--" 6/17/1891  
Russell Evans " 5/8/1895  
Florence Anna " 2/7/1897

On page 5 -I wrote in a missing name for you and on page 13 a date and name.

On page 189 you have the date of birth of James Evans, Jr as 2/23/1820 and on page 191 his date of death 1842 and his age at death 69. In my record I have for his birth 3/26/1773.

It is so easy to make mistakes in transferring dates, so tho't I had better call it to your attention.

John Barlow-son of John Barlow and Phoebe Bolton was my great

grandfather, so I certainly would be interested in the letters sent to him by his brother Nathan. You surely have a treasure. I am so sorry that we can not trace the Barlow line back farther. The copy of part of my chart will give you some further information about the Evans and Brooke family.

My husband is going to Washington the end of the month and he hopes to spend some time in the geneological library in both the Congressional and D.A.R. Libraries. If he secures any additional information I shall send it to you.
