1-**John Hager,** son of **Hans Jönsson**¹ and **Anna Jönsdotter**¹, was born on 15 Apr 1837 in Örsjö Väderqvarnen, Örsjö Parish, Malmöhus County, Skåne Province, Sweden, ² died on 27 Nov 1891 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, ³ at age 54, and was buried on 28 Nov 1891 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁴ Other names for John were Jöns Hagerlöf ⁵ and Jöns Hansson. ¹

General Notes: <u>1856</u> - Jöns moves from Kropps Jorden, Skivarp Parish to Bösarp Parish, Malmöhus County, Skåne Province

<u>1856</u> - Jöns Hansson moves from Vestra Virestad, Bösarp Parish, to Ultuna [Ultuna farm college], Helga Trefaldighet Parish, Uppsala County, Uppland Province

1857 - Jöns Hansson Hagerlöf is in Ultuna farm college, Helga Trefaldighet Parish, Uppsala County, Uppland Province. He is foreman pupil and comes from Bösarp Parish 19-Oct-1861 - foreman pupil Jöns Hansson Hagerlöf moves from Ultuna farm college, Helga Trefaldighet Parish, to Vist parish, Östergötland County & Province.

<u>1-Sep-1861</u> - Bokhållare (clerk) Jöns Hagerlöf moves to Säby, Vist Parish, from Öhrsjö. <u>28-Sep-1863</u> - Jöns Hagerlöf, bokhållare (clerk) moves from Vist Parish to Berga Gård (Berga Farm), Ununge Parish, Stockholm County, Uppland Province

<u>26-Mar-1864</u> - Jöns Hagerlöf moves from Berga Gård, Ununge Parish, to Stockholm. <u>1866</u> - dau. Anna is born - Jöns is an inspector.

3-Oct-1866 - Jöns Hagerlöf, with wife and 1 child, moves from Klara Parish (Stockholm) to Robertsfors Parish, Västerbotten County & Province

1867 - son Karl is born. Father J. Hagerlöf is a farm inspector.

<u>1869</u> - the family moves from Robertsfors Parish to Nysätra Parish [either Uppsala or Västerbotten, probably Västerbotten]. [7]

Jöns changed his surname to Hagerlöf about 1857. He was the only one of his siblings to change his surname from the patronymic Hansson (for his father Hans) to Hagerlöf.

John was born in Skona, Sweden, in 1836, was reared there, graduated from a college with a degree in civil engineering and followed his profession until 1870. While there he served in the regular army. Coming to the United States he spent a year in New Jersey, then lived on a farm near Greensboro, [Hale County] Alabama, and then identified himself with some of the pioneering activities at the foundation of the modern city of Birmingham, practicing as civil engineer until he retired in 1880. As a civil engineer, he was identified with the survey of the Birmingham & Nashville Railway from Birmingham, North, in association with Colonel John T. Milner. He was a republican and a member of the Lutheran Church. John Hager died at Birmingham in 1890. [2]

John T Milner was a civil engineer commissioned by the Alabama State Legislature in 1858 to survey and locate a railroad connecting the Tennessee and Alabama Rivers. This became the South and North Alabama Railroad. Mr. Milner was elected chief engineer of the railroad in 1858 and continued in that capacity until the railroad became part of the Louisville & Nashville RR system in 1872. [1] Given the time frame when John Milner worked on the railroad, and when John Hager immigrated to the United States (abt 1870) and when he came to Alabama (by 1872), it seems unlikely that John worked on this railroad as described in the History of Alabama cited above.

John changed his name from the original Swedish of Hagerlief (related by John Hager? (b. 1904)) or Hagerlaf, as Marie Hager Anderson related it to Karlene Hager Trimble.

It is very likely that the family immigrated in September - October 1869. The family found on the immigration records is a close but not exact match.

Departing Köpenhamn (Copenhagen, Denmark) 18 September 1869, destination New York. Arrived in New York on 26 October 1869 on the ship SS Fulton.

Johan Hagerlöf, born about 1837 from Sverrig/Sweden (Swedish Emigration Records) or 1839 from Denmark (NY Passenger lists), landmand (Danish/Swedish for farmer)

Anna Hagerlöf, born abt 1839 (SER), or 1838 (NY Passenger lists), wife

Ida Hagerlöf, age 3, born abt 1866

Edle Hagerlöf, 6 months, born 1869

In 1870 (20 July 1870) John Haggerty is living in Oxford township, Warren County, New Jersey. He is 33 (born about 1837), a laborer, and was born in Sweden as were his wife and children. John's wife Mary is 31, born about 1839, daughter Anna, 4, born about 1866, and son Charles, 1, born 1869. Also in the house is Hedrig Swvering, female, 24, also from Sweden. The names, ages (except for Mary/Marie), and birthplaces all match our Hagers.

The Hagers were in Alabama by August 1872 when daughter Bessie was born.

In the 1880 Census, John and Mary C Hager are living in the village of Warrior, Jefferson County, Alabama. John is 45 (born about 1835) and a carpenter. He was out of work for 2 months during the year. Mary is 43 (born about 1837). Both are from Sweden. Their children Annie, Charles, and Bettie [Bessie] are living with them. Annie and Charles were born in Sweden. Bessie was born in Alabama.

Found on the Bureau of Land Management web site was the sale 79 acres of government land to a John Hager of Jefferson County, Alabama. The sale was recorded October 30, 1882. The county where the land was located is not recorded, only it's location in relation to the Huntsville Meridian line.

By 1883 the Hagers are possibly in Decatur, Morgan County, Alabama. Daughter Annie marries Henry Jordan in Decatur in December 1883.

John moves to Birmingham about 1889. He owned a grocery store at 829 18th [Street], and lived there as well. [3]

In 1891 John's son-in-law Henry L Jordan and daughter Annie are living with him. [3]

John died at his home at 829 Eighteenth street at 11:10 in the evening of November 27, 1891. He came to Birmingham several years previously. John's funeral service was held at the Central Presbyterian church at 3:00 in the afternoon of November 28. [4]

Notes: Tom Moxley thought the Hagers may have settled in West Virginia when they first came to America, where there was a strong coal mining industry. The known facts do not support this. There is no documentation to date that John worked in the coal industry. Only son Charles worked in coal.

Noted events in his life were:

- Alt. Burial: 27 Nov 1891, Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁶

John married **Christina Maria** "**Marie**" **Höglander**, ⁷ daughter of **Johannes Höglander** and **Christina** "**Stina**" **Carlsdotter**, ¹⁰ on 24 Dec 1865 in Klara Parish, Stockholm, Sweden. ⁸ Christina was born on 30 Mar 1836 in Släthult, Fliseryd Parish, Kalmar County, Småland Province, Sweden, ¹¹ died on 6 Dec 1908 in Atlanta, Fulton County, Georgia, ¹² at age 72, and was buried on 10 Dec 1908 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁶ Another name for Christina was Kristina Maria Höglander. ¹¹ They had four children: **Annie Mae, Karl Adolf Fritiof, Charles Jacob**, and **Bessie Lee**.

Marriage Notes: John and Marie probably met at the Ultuna farm college about 1861.

General Notes: <u>12-Apr-1861</u> - Mamsell (Miss) Chr. Maria Höglander moves from Flugenäs, Frödinge Parish, Kalmar County, Småland Province, to Ultuna [farm college] [Helga Trefaldighet Parish, Uppsala County, Uppland Province]

1860 - Mamsell Chr. Maria Höglander comes to Ultuna farm college, Helga Trefaldighet Parish, from Frödinge Parish.

<u>24-Oct-1861</u> - pupil Christina Maria Höglander moves from Ultuna farm college, Helga Trefaldighet Parish, to Vist Parish, Östergötland County & Province.

1862 (Dec?) - Dairymaid Christina Maria Höglander moves from Säby, Vist Parish, to Stockholm. [5]

Marie was about 5 months pregnant with daughter Annie when she married Jöns.

After her husband John's death in 1891, Marie returned to Sweden, probably accompanied by her son Charles. Marie and Charles left Göteborg (Gothenburg, Sweden) on 28 October 1892 for the United States. They arrived in New York City November 17, 1892, on the ship Ethiopia, sailing from Glasgow. Marie (Mary on the passenger list) is a citizen of the United States, born in Sweden, and her most most recent residence was in Sweden. Accompanying them were Marie's sister Fredericka Swenson and her three young sons. [1, 4]

In 1893 Mrs Mary Hager is living in Birmingham in the Woodlawn station area with her daughter Annie and son-in-law Henry L Jordan, and Marie's sister Mrs Frederic Swenson. [2]

In the 1900 Census, Marie Hager is living in Kingdom township, Bibb Co, Alabama, with her son Charles. Marie is 63 years old and widowed. She was born in Sweden and immigrated in 1869. Marie has had 5 children, 3 are living.

Marie died in Atlanta, Georgia, on December 6 1908 at the home of her daughter Annie Hager Jordan, at 9:30 o'clock in the evening. She was surrounded by her children. Services were

conducted at the Jordan home by Presbyterian minister Rev. Dr. Brill. Marie's remains were then taken to the train to be taken to Birmingham for burial. She was buried at Oak Hill on December 8 with Rev I F Swallow of First Presbyterian church of Bessemer to conduct the graveside service. [3]

2-**Annie Mae Hager** was born on 8 Apr 1866 in Klara Parish, Stockholm, Sweden, ¹⁴ died on 7 Jul 1960 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, ¹⁵ at age 94, and was buried on 8 Jul 1960 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁶ Another name for Annie was Anna Maria Oskara Hagerlöf. ¹⁴

General Notes: Sponsors at her birth - farmer Hans Hagerlöf [probably Annie's grandfather Hans Jönsson] and his wife, warrant officer Johan[nes] Höglander, Mrs M. Lindström, Inspect. J. Höglander (Johan Alfred, brother of Christina Maria) and D? R. Hagerlöf. [3]

On the 1920 Census, Annie lists her year of immigration as 1875, she is a naturalized citizen. Her year of naturalization was not legible.

In the 1930 Census, Annie lists her year of immigration as 1870. She is a naturalized citizen.

At the time the entry for Charles Hager was written for the History of Alabama and Her People, Annie was [incorrectly] a widow, living in Bessemer, Alabama. [1]

Annie M Jordan died 7 July 1960 in Birmingham at age 94. She was the daughter of John A Hagerlief & Marie Hoglander. [2]

Annie married **Henry Lee Jordan**, son of **Edward Jordan** and **Mary Cockrell**, on 23 Dec 1883 in Decatur, Morgan County, Alabama. ¹⁷ Henry was born on 17 Aug 1856 in Columbia, Tennessee, ¹⁸ died on 7 Jun 1931 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, ¹⁹ at age 74, and was buried on 9 Jun 1931 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁶ They had no children.

Marriage Notes: Annie and Henry did not have any children. [John Hager's notes]

Joseph Swenson and his mother lived with Annie Hager and Henry Jordan in Atlanta after they immigrated from Sweden. Joseph's other two brothers lived with Bessie Hager & her husband George Stevenson and Charles Hager and his family. In appreciation for all the things Henry Jordan did for him, Joe took Jordan as his middle name. [Karlene Hager Trimble]

Their nephew and Henry's namesake, Henry Jordan Hager attended 2nd and 3rd grades at Ira Street School in Atlanta, Georgia, while living with them. Uncle Henry signed his report cards. [report cards]

General Notes: Henry's parents were Edward Jordan, born in Virginia, and Mary Cockrell, born in Kentucky. [4]

Henry Jordan was a conductor for the Southern Railway Company for thirty years. [3]

Henry Jordan was a pioneer of Birmingham and was associated with its railroads for more than 50 years. He was employed by the Louisville & Nashville Railroad when it had a box car for a station here. Later he became associated with the Southern Railway and continued this service for more than 40 years. He retired about 1921. [Obituary 1]

Henry and Annie married in Decatur, Alabama, in 1883.

By 1891, Henry and Annie have moved to Birmingham and are living with John Hager at 829 18th street. Henry is a conductor for GPRR - Georgia Pacific Railroad. [1]

In 1893 Henry L Jordan is a conductor on the Georgia Pacific Railroad. He is living in Woodlawn. His mother-in-law and her sister, Mrs Mary Hager and Mrs Frederic Swenson are also living with him. In 1895 Henry is a conductor for the Southern Railway. [1]

In the 1900 Census, Henry L Jordan is living at 5327 2nd Ave South in Woodland, Jefferson Co, Alabama. He is 43 years old, born in Tennessee, and a railroad conductor. His father was born in Virginia and his mother in Tennessee. Living with him is his wife Annie M, 34, born in Sweden. They have been married 16 years and have no children. Living with them is Annie's aunt Frederick Swenson (Freode Swinson on the census), and Frederick's son Joe.

By 1908, Henry, Annie, Marie Hager, Fredericka Swenson, and Joe Swenson are living in Atlanta, Georgia, at 87 Richardson street. Marie Hager passes away at their home on 6 December 1908. [2]

In the 1910 Census, Henry Lee Jordan is living in Atlanta, Georgia, on Richardson Street. He is 53 years old and a conductor for the railroad. He was born in Tennesse, his father in Virginia and his mother in Tennessee. Living with him are his wife Annie M, 44, born in Sweden, and aunt Frederick (or Fredericka) Swenson, 55, born in Sweden. Henry and Annie have been married for 26 years and have had no children.

In the 1920 Census, Henry is living in Atlanta on Howard Street. Living with him is his wife Annie, and "Fraedeck Sevson", Fredericka Swenson. Although Fredericka is listed as a roomer, she is Annie's aunt, and the mother of Joseph Swenson, whom Henry raised. Henry is a railroad conductor. Henry's birthplace is listed as Georgia, and his parents' as Tennessee.

In the 1930 Census, Henry and Annie are living in Bessemer, Jefferson County, Alabama, in the house of Annie's sister and brother-in-law George and Bessie Stevenson. They are listed as boarders. Henry is apparently retired - his occupation is listed as "none". Henry lists his birthplace as Tennessee, and his parents' birthplaces as Virginia and Kentucky.

Henry and Annie were living with, or perhaps staying with during his illness, their foster son Joseph Swenson when Henry passed away in 1931. Henry died at the home of his foster son Joseph Swenson at 55 Southwood Road. [Obituary 1 & 2] Southwood Road is in the Vestavia Hills area of Birmingham.

- 2-**Karl Adolf Fritiof Hagerlöf**²⁰ was born on 13 Nov 1867 in Robertsfors Bruk, Robertsfors Parish, Västerbotten County & Province, Sweden ²⁰ and died on 26 Jul 1868 in Robertsfors Bruk, Robertsfors Parish, Västerbotten County & Province, Sweden. ²¹

General Notes: Parish witnesses for Karl's birth include: B. Höglander (Betty Amalia) [his aunt], who lived with the family. [1]

- 2-**Charles Jacob Hager**²² was born on 3 May 1869 in Robertsfors Parish, Västerbotten County & Province, Sweden,²³ was christened on 11 May 1869 in Robertsfors Parish, Västerbotten County & Province, Sweden,²⁴ died on 12 Apr 1936 in Flat Creek, Walker County, Alabama,²⁵ at age 66, and was buried on 14 Apr 1936 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama.⁶ The cause of his death was suicide self-inflicted gunshot. Another name for Charles was Karl Jacob Hagerlöf.²³

General Notes: Charles was born in Umea, Sweden, May 3, 1869, and was brought by his parents to this country a year later. [8]

He came to the United States from Sweden with his family in 1871 and settled in Alabama that year. [9] Or about 15 November 1870, arriving in New York from Gatenberg, Sweden. [13]

Charles Hager spent his boyhood days at Decatur, Alabama, attending public schools there. He was graduated from high school in 1889 and during 1891 was a student in Smith's Business College, an affiliated institution of the University of Kentucky. After spending a year in the offices of the Louisville & Nashville Railway at Decatur, he entered the employ of the DeBardeleben Coal & Iron Co. at Bessemer. He remained with the same company when a year later it was taken over by the Tennessee Coal, Iron, & Railway Company and was in the service of that great industrial corporation until 1898, acting as yard master. Following that he was assistant superintendent of mines at Belle Ellen for Bessemer Coal, Iron & Land Company until 1904. For two years he was a mine superintendent in Kentucky, and his varied experience as a superintendent of coal mines has extended to many localities in Kentucky, Alabama, and Virginia.

In 1921 Mr. Hager became mine superintendent at Maxine, Alabama, for the Pratt

Consolidated Coal Company. In 1924 the Pratt Company was absorbed by Alabama By-Products Corporation. In the meantime, in 1922 Mr. Hager had transferred to Cordova, where he has since practiced as a superintendent of the Ruby Mine, owned and operated by Alabama By-Products Corporation. This mine has a capacity of five hundred tons of bituminous coal a day, and there are one hundred and fifty employees at the Ruby Mine.

Mr. Hager is owner of farm and mineral lands on Shade Mountain in Jefferson County. His particular service to the government at the time of the World war was in speeding up coal production and for a period of nearly three years, he put in eighteen hours a day under the pressure of extraordinary responsibilities. He is a democrat, a member of the Presbyterian Church at Cordova, and in Masonry is affiliated with Blocton Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, Tuscaloosa Commandery No. 13 Knights Templar and Zamora Temple of the Mystic Shrine at Birmingham. He is a member of the Cordova Kiwanis Club. [8]

He was a pioneer in the coal mining industry in Alabama. With the exception of five years spent in Kentucky and Virginia his work has been confined to mining in Alabama. [9]

Charles' son, Henry, was a life-long employee of Alabama By-Products Corp. [7]

While a young man, Charles worked for a sawmill. Someone was stealing from the sawmill, so Charles was given the task to guard the mill at night and catch this thief. The thief returned, and Charles ended up killing him. Charles' mother Marie thought the best thing in this situation was for Charles to "return home to Sweden". Which he did for some time. [3] Charles left Göteborg (Gothenburg, Sweden) on 28 October 1892 for the United States. Charles arrived in New York City November 17, 1892, on the ship Ethiopia, sailing from Glasgow, with his mother Marie Hager. Charles is a citizen of the United States, born in Sweden, and his most recent residence was in Sweden. Charles ia a lumber dealer. Marie's sister Fredericka Swenson (or Svensson) and her three young sons immigrated with them on that trip. [4, 10]

Tom Moxley's (Charles's future grandson-in-law) grandfather Moxley worked for Charles at Belle Ellen mine when the Moxley's first came to Alabama. [Tom Moxley]

When first wife Lillian died in January 1900, Charles was time keeper for the Bessemer Land and Improvement company at Belle Ellen. [11]

In the 1900 Census, Charles J Hager is living in Kingdom township, Bibb County, Alabama. He is 31, widowed, and born in Sweden. Charles is a post master. Living with him is his mother Marie Hager, 63. Charles and Marie immigrated in 1869. Also living with them is William (no last name listed), 17, a black house boy. Living nearby (on the previous census page) is William Herbert and his family. William's daughter Maggie and Charles would marry in 1902.

Charles and Maggie probably lived in Belle Ellen for a year after their marriage. Letters from William Herbert to Maggie and Charles in September and October 1903 indicate they moved out of state, passing through Chattanooga on their way. They may have moved to Kentucky as indicated in Charles' biography in the History of Alabama.

Charles was in Walker County, Alabama, in 1904 and 1906 when sons John and Henry were born.

At the time his mother Marie Hager died in Atlanta in December 1908, Charles is living at Belle Ellen in Bibb County, Alabama. [1]

In the 1910 Census, Charles is living in Birmingham, Alabama. He is 39 years old, and a manager at a coal mine. Living with him is his wife Maggie (looks like Mattie on the census), 25, and children John W, 5, Henry J, 3, and Marie H, 1. Charles was born in Sweden and immigrated in 1877. He is a naturalized citizen. Maggie was born in Ohio and the children in Alabama. Living next door is Maggie's sister Sadie and her husband Edwin Lykes and their children.

In 1913 Charles Jacob Hager, mine superintendent, living in Birmingham, declared his intention to become a US citizen. [13]

In 1917 Charles Jacob Hager completed his Petition for Naturalization in Birmingham. He was living in Bessemer (Jefferson County) and a mine supt. He came to the US about 15 November 1870 and resided in Alabama since 5 June 1871. Charles' petition included the names, birthdates and birth places of his children. The petition was deinined in 1919 because Charles did not appear at the hearing. [14]

Charles and his family remained in Alabama until 1916 when son Charles was born in Alabama. They were in Virginia in 1918 when son Herbert was born. In 1920 they were in Tennessee.

In October 1918, they were apparently in the Appalachia, Wise County, Virginia, area, as son Herbert was born there on 3 October. [16, 17]

In 1920, Charles is living in Grundy County, Tennessee. He is 51, born in Sweden, and is a foreman for a coal mine. Living with Charles are his wife Maggie, 35, born in Ohio, her parents in Wales, and children Henry J, 13, Margaret, 7, Charles J Jr, 4 years & 8 months, and Herbert, 1 year and 3 months. All the children were born in Alabama, except Herbert who was born in Virginia. Charles' and Maggie's children John, Marie, and George are not living with them. It is not yet known where they were living in 1920. [2]

Today (early 21st century) southern Grundy County is home to the town of Monteagle, along Interstate 24, west of Chattanooga.

Charles and his family were back in Alabama by spring 1921 when son Paul was born.

In the 1930 Census, Charles is living at Flat Creek, Walker County, Alabama. He is 60 years old, born in Sweden, and the superintendent of a coal mine. Living with him are his wife Maggie, age 45 & born in Ohio, and seven of their children. The children are Marie, age 20, George, 18, Margurite, 16, Charles Jr, 13, Herbert, 11, Paul, 8, and Clifton, 6. All the children were born in Alabama except Herbert. Herbert's birthplace was illegible except it ended in "ia". The 1920 Census showed Herbert as born in Virginia.

Charles loved his daughter Marie the best. He even favored her over wife Maggie, and

probably used Marie to be cruel to Maggie. One time, he promised to take Maggie in to town. While she waited on the porch for him, he drove by without stopping with Marie and her friends in the car, taking them to town. [15]

Charles was bed-ridden for one month prior to his death. He had emphysema, and his doctor told him he would not get better. He committed suicide on Easter Sunday, 1936, shooting himself in the head. His son John found him. [5]

I remember Catharine Phillips Hager (wife of Henry Hager) telling me that she, Henry, and daughter Jane went to Flat Creek for Easter 1936. Henry had been sick that winter so Catharine drove. The seats in the cars did not adjust back then, and being 8 months pregnant with Sara, the steering wheel rubbed against her abdomen the whole way. While almost everyone was out of the house either celebrating Easter or at an Easter egg hunt, Charles shot himself in the head in the bathroom. Henry was in the house at the time, since he was still recovering. [7]

Charles lived for several hours after he shot himself. He was conscious and continued to give orders like he always did. [6]

Charles wrote a suicide note before he shot himself:

My health is gone

I am out of work

So I will end it all I don't want to be a burden

Bell - undertaker

Private funeral - no flowers

Charles was still living in company housing at the Flat Creek mine when he died. Based on his suicide note, he may have just been told by the company that they were letting him go.

Charles married **Lillian Milner**, daughter of **Elisha C Milner** and **Mary Caroline Brown**, on 6 Dec 1896 in Woodlawn, Jefferson County, Alabama. ²⁷ Lillian was born on 26 Feb 1878 in Georgiana, Butler County, Alabama, ²⁸ died on 29 Jan 1900 in Belle Ellen mines, Bibb County, Alabama, ²⁹ at age 21, and was buried on 31 Jan 1900 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁶ They had two children: **Carl** and **infant**.

General Notes: Lilian is probably the Lilian Milner, age 3 born about 1877, found in the 1880 Census (familysearch.org). She was born in Alabama. Her parents were Elisha and Mary C. Milner, age 48 and 45. They were living in Georgiana, Butler County, AL, with their 8 children, age 23 to 3. No occupation is listed for Elisha.

This family is reportedly headed by Mary C Bowman [should be Brown] and Elisha C Milner. They married in Pike County, Georgia, on 16 November 1852. [5, 6]

Lillian's mother Mrs E Milner, of Woodlawn (Birmingham) is listed as one of her survivors as is her brothers Mr A E Milner and Mr E C Milner, both appear with the Milner family on the 1880 Census. [4]

Lillian Milner's father surveyed and laid out part of Birmingham, Alabama. John Hager (her future father-in-law) worked with him laying out the railroad. The Milner family may be buried at Oak Hill Cemetary, Birmingham, Alabama. [2] It is not certain that Lillian's father worked on the railroad, and he may have been confused with the more famous John T Milner. [CAR]

John T. Milner and his family were also found in the 1880 Census in Jefferson County. John is 53 years old, and a Civil Engineer. He was born in Georgia, the same as Elisha Milner. He is married to Florrie, age 41. Living with them are their three daughters and one son. One of the daughters is named Lilian, age 18.

Members of both of the Elisha and John Milner families appear to be buried in Oak Hill Cemetery. [3]

Mrs Hager, wife of Charles J Hager, died suddenly at Belle Ellen of heart failure on 30 January 1900. Her mother and mother-in-law were both with her when she died. She was a woman of very sweet and amiable character, and was much loved by all who came in contact with her. [4]

Lillian actually died after childbirth with her second child, [1] who is buried with her and son Carl at Oak Hill Cemetery.

The internment records for Oak Hill Cemetery show the following ages at death and internment dates for Lillian and her children:

General Notes: This infant died at birth. [Karlene Hager Trimble]

The Oak Hill Cemetery internment records record this infant as "S.B.", for still born.

Charles next married **Maggie Herbert**, daughter of **William Herbert** and **Margaret Hopkins**, on 19 Nov 1902 in Belle Ellen mines, Bibb County, Alabama. ³³ Maggie was born on 2 Oct 1884 in Bridgeport, Belmont County, Ohio, ³⁴ died on 16 Sep 1967 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, at age 82, and was buried on 18 Sep 1967 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁶ They had nine children: **John William**, **Henry Jordan, Marie Herbert, George Stevenson, Marguerite, Charles Jacob "Bunk," Herbert, Paul, and Clifton Hayes**.

Marriage Notes: Based on letters from William Herbert to daughter Maggie, Charles and Maggie were married sometime between January 1902 and September 1903.

General Notes: Maggie was born at either Bridgeport or Martins Ferry, Ohio, both in Belmont County.

Margaret completed her education at Judson College, Marion, Alabama. [4]

When her husband Charles killed himself on Easter Sunday, 1936, Maggie's sister Mable and her family were visiting. When the shot inside the house was heard, Maggie said, "Oh no, he's done it." [5]

After Charles died in 1936, the oldest children, John, Henry, Marie, George, and Marguerite helped financially to support Maggie and their younger brothers. [1]

In 1940 Maggie H Hager is living in Birmingham. She is 55, widowed, and has had one year of college. Living with her are daughter Marie, Charles J Jr, Herbert, Paul & Clifton, and daughter & granddaughter Marguerite and Marjorie Japp. [6]

Maggie had long hair that reached to her fanny that she always wore in a bun. [5]

Her great-niece remembered that she always had salt cellers on the table. [5]

Maggie had breast cancer that had spread to her lung. The doctors operated but any other treatment she might have had is not remembered. [3] It was always said that Maggie lived 20 years after she was supposed to die, so that would mean she was diagnosed sometime in the late 1940's.

Maggie Hager was a native of Ohio and a member of the Hunter Street Baptist Church. Her last residence was at 1529 41st Street in Belview Heights, Birmingham. She was survived by her daughters Mrs John E Anderson of Lake Placid, Florida, and Mrs H B Frith of New Orleans, and her seven sons John W, Henry J, Charles J, and Paul of Birmingham, George S of Jasper, and Clifton H of Chattanooga, Tennessee. 3-John William Hager³⁸ was born on 6 Dec 1904 in Corona, Walker County,

Alabama, ³⁹ died on 27 Aug 1991 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, at age 86, and was buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama.

General Notes: In 1918 when John was 13 years old and the family was likely in Appalachia, Wise County, Virginia, John helped deliver food to families hit with the 1918 Spanish Flu pandemic. If a family was affected they would han a white towel or cloth outside their door. John had the job to deliver food to those homes. [1]

In the 1930 Census, John was living in Birmingham, Alabama. He was an engineer in the mining industry. He appeared to be a lodger in the house of Harold & Kathryn Wood.

After the death of his father, Charles Hager, in 1936, John took over as superintendent of the Flat Creek coal mine where Charles was super. when he died.

John left a \$5,000 bequest in his will to Oak Hill Cemetery for the perpetual care of the Hager plot. [files of Hager plot at Oak Hill]

4-**John William "Jack" Hager Jr.** was born on 2 Aug 1933 in Alabama, ⁴² died on 16 May 1966 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, ⁴³ at age 32, and was buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. The cause of his death was car wreck.

General Notes: Jack was a graduate of Auburn University and a lieutenant in the Navy for 4 years. At the time of his death he was an associate member of his uncle's architecture firm Paul Hager & Associates. He had previously worked for Davis, Speake & Thrasher. [1]

Jack was honorably discharged from the Navy May 1, 1957.

Cousin Jack was killed in a car wreck. His fiancee was badly injured, and took much time to recover.

John William Hager, Jr, was killed 16 May 1966 at 9:20 PM in a head-on collision

on Montclair Road near Crossridge Road in Mountain Brook (Birmingham), Alabama. His passenger Jacqueline C Degaris, 31, and the driver of the other car Myrtle W Ethridge, 24, were severly injured. [1] Information indicates that Jacqueline never married (CAR 2006).

Jacqueline Claudia DeGaris, age 84, died 23 April 2019 in Birmingham. Miss DeGaris graduated from Pell City High Scool-1953, Monticello College-1955 (Associate of Science), University of AL-1957 (Bachelor of Science-Bacteriology) & New Orleans School of Medical Technology-1958. She worked at South Highland Pharmacy from 1958-2008 as a Medical Technologist & Pharmacy Technician. She lived in Redmont Gardens Apartments in Mountain Brook from 1958 to 2009, shen she retired to Greenbriar at the Altamont. Survived by niece Lydia Pursell & nephews Annsley DeGaris Sumpter DeGaris & John DeGaris. [2]

- 3-Henry Jordan Hager was born on 28 Oct 1906 in Burnwell Mine, between Flat Creek & Dora, Walker County, Alabama, died on 4 Nov 1985 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, at age 79, and was buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama.

General Notes: Henry was named for his uncle, Henry Jordan, his father Charles' sister Annie's husband.

When he was younger, Henry was known as Hank. As an adult most people called him Henry, but old friends still called him Hank. [3]

Henry attended 2nd and 3rd grades (1915-1916) at Ira Street School in Atlanta, Georgia, while living with his Aunt Annie Hager Jordan and Uncle Henry Jordan. Uncle Henry signed his report cards. Henry attended the second grade for the first 3 quarters, and was then promoted to the 3rd grade by examination (Apr 3 1916) and attended the 4th quarter of the 3rd grade. [report cards]

When he was young, Henry hoboed on a train from West Virginia to Atlanta, and came down with appendicitis on the way and almost died. His Aunt Annie Jordan lived in Atlanta, and took him to the doctor. [3]

In the 1930 Census, Henry Hager was living in Birmingham, Alabama, on Highland Avenue. He was 23 years old and an engineer, working in the mechanical industry. His roommate, or lodger on the census, was D. A. York (?), 36 years old and a physician.

Henry's first job after college was at American Cast Iron Pipe Co, in the drafting office, where future in-law Stephen Moxley (father of Henry's future son-in-law) was his boss. Stephen Moxley was later president of the company. Alabama By Products, the company Henry worked for most of his life, was a major supplier to ACIPCo. [3]

In addition to his B.S. degree in Mining Engineering from the University of Alabama, Henry also received a Masters from the University on a research scholarship with the US Bureau of Mines. [4]

The Mine Foreman Certificate of Competency that Henry received in 1939 is required in order to be an underground mine foreman in the coal industry. Underground mining is quite hazardous. [4]

Daughter Sara and son-in-law Tom Moxley struck up a conversation with a man they met while out to dinner in Birmingham. The man happened to have worked in coal mining. Sara said her father was Henry Hager. The man said that he had been a negotiator for the union and Henry was the fairest man he ever dealt with. [1]

Henry was instrumental in getting the Negro high school built in Walker or Jefferson county. They wanted to hang his picture in the high school. Henry did not want it there as he did not want everyone to know all he did to help other people. [2]

When I was about 5 or 6, I remember Granddaddy telling this story: Once upon a time there was a band of robbers sitting around the campfire. The leader said, "Pedro, tell us a story." Grandmother and Granddaddy would occasionally drive up to Huntsville from Birmingham. Granddaddy would come in, say Hello, have a drink of whiskey, and stand around jingling the change and keys in his pockets. He had come, said hello, and now it was time to go. Grandmother, of course, needed to sit and visit for a while. [CAR]

Henry had scars on his lungs, probably from childhood T. B. (tuberculosis). He received further scarring on his lungs in the winter of 1936 from severe pneumonia. He smoked most of his life, usually in secret. [5] He died November 4, 1985, from complications after lung surgery. After surgery to remove part of his lung, a clot formed and/or broke loose and traveled to his lungs causing them to fill with fluid as if he had pneumonia. This was his second surgery to remove part of his lung. The first surgery was several years prior to the second.

Catharine was born on 18 Jan 1909 in Alabama, died on 22 Dec 1999 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, ⁴⁶ at age 90, and was buried on 24 Dec 1999 in Elmwood Cemetery, Birmingham, Alabama. ⁴⁶ They had four children: **Jane Marie, Sara Ferrell, Henry Jordan**, and **Phillip Terry**.

Marriage Notes: Henry and Catharine were married in the yard at Dr. Phillip's house in Dora. The preacher goofed, and said "John" instead of "Henry" during the ceremony. [daughters Jane and Sara]

Catharine and Henry may have honeymooned in Chattanooga, Tennessee. [Sarah Hendrix]

A party was given by Catharine and Henry's children, Jane Hager and Calvin Reuther, Sara Hager and Tom Moxley, Henry and Sandra Nelson Hager, Jr., and Phillip Hager, in celebration of their 50th wedding anniversary on August 1, 1981, at the Vestavia Country Club in Birmingham, Alabama. [invitation]

General Notes: As a child, Catharine used to help her father out in his doctor's office.

Catharine attended Margaret Allen School for Girls in Birmingham.

In her younger days, Catharine was an artist. She painted china, as well as drawing and painting. Only 1 drawing and 2 paintings survive. Catharine left most of her artwork at Judson when she left school. A drawing of a teapot executed when she was 9 is owned by daughter Jane (as of 2012 by granddaughter Catherine Reuther). Daughter Sara owns an oil painting of wisteria, and Phillip owns an oil painting of fruit.

In 1925-1926, Catharine attended Rivers Academy/Athens College in Athens, Alabama. She graduated from there in May 1926. In 1927 Catharine was a sophmore at Chowan College in Murphreesboro, North Carolina. Cousin Margaret Murrah was Director & Coach of Athletics, and aunt Lena Terry was Professor of Home Economics that year. In 1929, Catharine was a junior at Howard College in Birmingham. Also in her class was William M Herbert, cousin of Catharine's future husband Henry Hager. [1]

Catharine taught school for a short while either before and/or after she married Henry. [Sara Moxley]

She was an excellent seamstress. Catherine could go into a store, find a dress she or her daughters liked, do a quick sketch on the street, and then go home and make the

dress.

Listed as a survivor on her obituary was her sister-in-heart, Sarah Fleetwood Hendrix. She and Sarah met in the spring of 1914 when they were 5 years old, and remained lifelong and close friends. Sarah was known to all Catharine's children and grandchildren as Aunt Sarah.

When Catharine died, her daughter Sara had just bought her a nice nightgown and bed jacket for Christmas since Catharine was confined to bed. She was buried on Christmas Eve in her new nightgown.

4-**Jane Marie Hager** was born on 15 Jun 1933 in Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, died on 29 Oct 2012 in Atlanta, Fulton County, Georgia, ⁴⁶ at age 79, and was buried on 2 Nov 2012 in Maple Hill Cemetery, Huntsville, Alabama. ⁴⁶

General Notes: Jane was born in 1933 in Birmingham, Alabama. She grew up in the coal mines outside of Birmingham where her father Henry was a manager at the mines.

Jane and her mother Catharine clashed from the beginning, as Jane was something of a tomboy and a troublemaker, and destined to NOT be the proper lady her mother wanted her to be.

She would do things like digging up the dead hunting dog to find out what happened to it after it died, and putting her little brother up in the top of a skinny tree, and then swinging that tree around with him hanging onto the top.

Just before she started high school, the family left the coal mines and moved to Birmingham. After high school she went to Auburn University, where she met Cal Reuther, and decided to get married. Jane always said she got married at age 19 to get away from her mother.

Jane married Cal in 1953, and when he finished school later that year, they moved across the country to Seattle, then to Pittsburgh, back to Seattle, on to Fort Walton Beach, Florida, and then to California. By then there were two children, and more than ten years had passed. And she was now on our way back to Alabama to Huntsville. They stopped moving around the country and stayed put in Alabama.

Jane always loved arts and crafts. There were always numerous craft projects going on at her house. She tried everything from ceramics to macramé to batik to copper enameling. She mastered them all. In the early 1970's she tried weaving, and fell in love with everything about it - weaving, spinning, and dyeing the yarn.

She was a founding member and president of the Huntsville Fiber Guild, and started her own weaving business.

About 1970 Jane must have decided she could no longer wait for Cal (who never liked the beach) to take her to Florida every year. Cal taught her and their 10 or 11 year-old son how to hook up the camping trailer to the station wagon, set it up at the campground, and how to empty the holding tanks. She was never comfortable pulling into a gas station with the trailer, so she would pull off the road, change places with Russell, and that young boy would pull it up to the pump. It is amazing she convinced Cal to "let" her do it and that she made those trips for six or seven years on her own, until the trailer was wrecked in an accident.

In 1993 Jane had aneurysms in the brain, and spent a good portion of the year in and out of the hospital. After that, she gave up weaving and her business as she could no longer concentrate enough to do that.

In 2000, Cal died, and plans were made for Jane to move to Atlanta to be near her daughter Catherine and soon-to-be son-in-law Bryan Kennedy.

Between Cal's death and the move to Atlanta, Jane's future son-in-law Bryan moved in with her. They became great friends and Bryan continued to live with after he and Catherine married until Jane and Bryan both moved to Atlanta a few months later.

Jane loved living in her retirement community in Sandy Springs, Georgia. She made great friends, and went on every outing there was, especially if it involved lunch.

Jane loved, in no particular order, the beach in Florida, chocolate, good friends, family, art, travel & adventure, dogs, angels, hugs, her church, chocolate, Florida.

During college (Auburn, AL), Cal owned and flew his own airplane, an Ercoupe.

In 1951 or 1952, Cal flew to Connecticut from Auburn through bad weather with no radio and was the only plane flying over NY. Coming back to to Auburn, he developed trouble in Maryland (?). He was able to land but could not afford to fix the plane, and left it at the airport. [Jane Reuther]

During college at API Cal worked for Mr. Fortner at Jake's Joint and the Elk's Club. He met Jane at Jake's Joint. Mrs. Fortner gave Cal her recipe for Barbecue Sauce and Barbecue Basting Sauce that he used throughout his life to make fantastic barbecue chicken on the grill.

Cal graduated from Alabama Polytechnic Institute (API - later re-named Auburn University) in Auburn, Alabama, in 1953, with a Bachelors of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. His first job was across the country for Boeing in Seattle, Washington, working on the B-52 airplane. He left Boeing in 1956 for Westinghouse in Pittsburgh, PA, but was on his way back to Boeing and Seattle in 1958 when Jane was pregnant with Cathy. Just weeks after Cathy was born in September, they headed for a new assignment in Fort Walton Beach, FL, and the BOMARC missile program at Eglin AFB.

In 1963, Cal, Jane, Cathy and Russell moved to California where Cal worked on the Minuteman weapon system.

In April 1965, Cal, Jane and the children moved to Huntsville, Alabama, where Cal continued his work for Boeing, this time on the space program. He was responsible for the Boeing Saturn V Logistics Support Staff, developing a Logistics Support Plan. He was also responsible for Saturn V Logistics activities and program schedule. In 1967 he assumed responsibility for directing the preparation of the Saturn V Flight Manual, a single source reference prepared specifically for the astronauts' use.

When Boeing reduced their operations in Huntsville in 1974 (the summer President Richard Nixon resigned and the fall Cathy got her driver's license), Cal and Jane decided to stay in Huntsville rather than be transferred to another city, and Cal went to work for Sperry Corporation on tactical missile systems at MICOM. In 1980 he began a brief stint at Guest Associates providing marketing and technical representation for technically oriented customers, as well as consultation to small business through the Small Business Administration.

In 1982, Cal went back to work for Boeing on marketing management assignments for the Air Force, MSFC, MICOM, and SSDC customers. He retired early in 1993 after Jane's brain aneurysms and surgery that year.

Early in their marriage, when they were young and poor, Cal decided to start making furniture instead of buying it. He bought the appropriate tools and set up shop in the spare bedroom in their apartment. The first thing he made was a long low bench in the Danish Modern style. He made their bedroom furniture and later on a hi-fi cabinet, kitchen table, and a new dresser for Jane in the 1970's.

In 1983, when his mother Lydia was no longer making the family Christmas

cookies, Cal took up the task, often with daughter Cathy's help. He made their favorites Springerli, Brownie Lebkuchen & Schwaben Brodli, and new ones as well. Just as Lydia did, he kept track of what he made and how many. In 2002, Cathy took up the tradition on her own. Cal also had a vegetable garden for many years, and took up canning at that time. Not only did he can vegetables, but he also made jellies and pickles.

In 1988 & 1989, Cal and Jane built a new, larger house on Mountain Springs Circle in Huntsville and moved in in April 1989. The house included a 3-car garage with large shop attached, and Jane's large weaving room over the garage and shop. After Cal's death, the house was sold to Hank and Kathy Perkins, friends from church, and a school friend (Hank) of daughter Cathy's when growing up.

Cal entered Huntsville Hospital November 25, 1999 (Thanksgiving Day) for heart bypass surgery on November 26. The surgery was successful, but numerous complications ensued due to Cal's emphysema and the steroids he had been taking for the emphysema that interfered with the healing process. After seven weeks in ICU, he passed away due to multiple organ system failure on January 14, 2000, at 5:05 PM. Daughter Cathy, son Russell, future son-in-law Bryan Kennedy, and Dr. T. Benton Washburn were present. He was buried January 18, 2000 at Maple Hill Cemetery in Huntsville.

Unknown to his family until after he entered the hospital, Cal had been having heart problems for some time. Nitroglycerin pills were found in his study for heart pain. Cal left a folder of instructions for his daughter Cathy just prior to entering the hospital in case he passed away. The information and instructions included the notice of his death to be published in the newspaper. Cathy used this almost as he had written it.

General Notes: Steve went to work for his father at Hager Oil when he graduated from college. When father George became too sick to work, Steve became partowner of Hager Oil with his two sisters. He later bought them out. [4]

Hager Oil Company is owned and operated by Steve Hager, a Jasper native who graduated from the University of Alabama with a degree in Engineering. Mr. Hager assumed control of the company from his father in the early 80's and began to expand and grow the business. [1]

Hager Oil Company is located in Jasper, Alabama, serving all of north central Alabama, and surrounding states. Hager Oil has been a family owned and operated business since it's founding in 1954. Hager Oil has grown extensively over the last several decades, expanding its industrial lubricants division to compete on the highest level. We have devoted a large part of our staff to serving our customer's needs large and small. [1]

Hager Oil sells in various industries including mining, steel, timber, natural gas, railroad and agriculture. One of their most unusual products is a lubricant for the railroad to use on the curves of railroad tracks. They also sell lubicants and fuel for farming equipment. [4]

Hager Oil Company also owns and operates several branded Texaco locations, in addition to many dealer owned branded and non-branded service stations. [1]

On 8 March 2014 Steve was honored by the University of Alabama College of Engineering by being inducted into the 2014 class of Distinguished Engineering Fellows.

"Since taking over his father's company nearly 40 years ago, Russell Steve Hager has grown Hager Oil Co. Inc. into one of Alabama's premier petroleum distributors, serving more than 700 customers with millions of gallons each month. The company supplies all of north central Alabama and areas in the surrounding states of Mississippi, Tennessee and Georgia. Coming from a proud family of University of Alabama engineers, Hager earned his degree in mechanical engineering from the Capstone in 1973. He took over his father's company not long after graduation, and he has strategically grown the company. Today, Hager Oil Co. sells more than 34 million gallons of petroleum products

with revenues of more than \$100 million serving the mining, steel, timber, natural gas, railroad and agriculture industries." [2]

In 2014 Steve sold Hager Oil Company to long-time friend James Eidson. Steve planned to continue working for the company. [3]

General Notes: In 1930 Marguerite Hager, of Flat Creek, is a freshman at the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa. In 1932 she is a sophmore studying in the School of Education. [11]

On 19 September 1931 a marriage license was issued to P D Japp, of Selma, and Miss Marguerite Hager of Bessemer. The following day P D Japp of Selma, formerly of Tuscaloosa, married Margaret Hager of Tuscaloosa. [6, 7] The news report of their marriage does not include the names of any family, such as parents, nor of any attendees, such as other relatives. [CAR, 2021]

25 Nov 1931, Mrs. R. D. Japps [sic] is a patient in the Selma Baptist hospital. [10]

In December 1931 Mrs. Paul Japp was visiting relatives in Birmingham. Mr. & Mrs. Japp will leave next week to spend Christmas in Cincinnati. [12]

In May 1932 Mrs P D Japp [of Selma] was spending a few weeks with her family in Jasper. In July Mr & Mrs Paul Japp spent a few days in Tuscaloosa visiting friends at the University of Alabama. In August they took an apartment with Mrs Thomas Forbes on Lamar avenue. [13, 14, 15]

In March 1933 Mr & Mrs Paul Japp and baby were in Jackson, Alabama. [16]

In 1933 (or 1932 when the directory infomation was probably gathered) Paul D Japp and wife Marguerite were living in Montgomery, Alabama. [4]

Marguerite and Paul appear to have moved to Cincinnati about 1933. In 1934 Paul along with daughter Ann are pictured in the Cincinnati Enquirer. [8]

After she and Paul divorced, she had a young child, and moved back home to live with her mother. [1]

It appears that Paul Japp and Marguerite separated about 1932 or 1933. Their divorce was granted in 1935 in Birmingham. [3]

In 1935 Marguerite Japp and daughter Marjorie were living in Walker County, Alabama, [5] probably with her parents.

In 1940 Marguerite H Japp, 27, and daughter Marjorie A, 7, are living in Birmingham with her mother and siblings. She is divorced, has completed 2 years of college, and is a saleslady at a retail department store. In 1939 she worked for 52 weeks for \$1089 salary [annual]. [5]

From 1937 to 1942 Mrs Marguerite Japp is living in Birmingham (in Ensley or Fairview). Until 1941 she is a saleswoman for Sears Roebuck & Co. In 1942 she is a department manager. [4]

When Marguerite married Burt Frith in 1942, she was living in Birmingham and a clerk. [3] After their marriage, they probably moved to Atlanta where Burt was living, and where he enlisted in the US Army in 1944.

In 1944 Marguerite and Howard B Frith are shown as in both Birmingham and in Atlanta. [4]

About 1947 they moved to New Orleans, Louisiana. [4, 9]

Beginning in 1949 Mrs Marguerite H (Maude in 1949) Frith is listed as a saleswoman and teacher with Singer Sewing. [4]

About June 1965 Marguerite and Burt moved to Shreveport, Louisiana. He died there six months later. [9]

Mrs Marguerite Frith died 29 December 1970 at age 58 [born about 1912]. Her next of kin was husband Burt Frith. [2]

General Notes: Although it is not definitive, I believe Paul Japp is the Paul D Japp from Cincinnati, Ohio. There are almost no Paul Japps to be found in the US, so it seems certain this is the first husband of Marguerite Hager. [CAR 2012] Paul is correctly identified as Paul Japp of Cincinnati, son of Reuben, in a 4-generation picture published in the Cincinnati Enquirer in 1934 that includes his daughter Ann Japp. Ann is a toddler and looks the right age to be the daughter of Marguerite. [16, CAR 2021]

Paul's parents:

Reuben Springer Japp and Elizabeth Brode

They married 8 May 1909 in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. Elizabeth was previously married to Mr. Strehlow.

Reuben was a reporter, born about 1884 in Cincinnati to Jno G Japp & Lena Everhart; Elizabeth was born about 1882 in Brimfield, Illlinois, to Geo W Brode and Clara Lovett. [2, 3, 4]

In April 1910, Paul D Japp is 3 months old (born abt Dec 1909), born in Iowa, and living in Cincinnati, Ohio, with his parents Reuben S & Elizabeth B Japp, grandfather John George Japp, and aunt Flossie Japp. John G Japp owns a hair goods business, and Reuben is working with him. [5]

In 1920 Paul D Japp is living in Cincinnati. He is 10, born in Iowa. Paul is living with his parents Reuben S & Elizabeth Japp, and younger sisters Mary, Dorothy, & Ruby, and servant Frances Ross, 18. Reuben is a manufacturer of hair goods. [6]

In 1929 Paul Japp is living in Columbus, Ohio. He is a student. [1]

In 1930 Paul Japp is living in Cincinnati. He is 20, born in Iowa. No occupation is listed. Paul is living with his parents Reuben & Elizabeth Japp, and younger sisters Mary E, Dorothy, & Ruby V. Also in the house is Mollie Walsh, 19, servant, from

Ireland. [8]

By September 1931 Paul is an insurance agent in Selma, Dallas County, Alabama. He is described as formerly of Tuscaloosa. [14]

In March 1933 Paul and Marguerite are in Jackson, Alabama. Paul is representing the Brown Service Company, one of the largest burial insurance companies and is associated with the Woodson Furniture & Undertaking Co. [19]

In 1933 Paul D Japp and wife Marguerite are living in Montgomery, Alabama. Paul is an agent for Brown Serv. Funeral Co. [1]

Also in 1933 Paul D Japp is living in Cincinnati, Ohio, in the home of his father Reuben S Japp. Paul is an insurance agent. [1]

In 1934 Paul Japp, son of Reuben, and Paul's daughter Ann Japp are in the Cincinnati Enquirer as "of Hyde Park", a neighborhood in Cincinnati. [16]

Since Paul & daughter Ann are described as "of Hyde Park", Cincinnati, in 1934, it is likely that the entire family moved to Cincinnati about 1933-1934, and Paul and Marguerite separated about 1934-1935. [CAR]

In 1935 - 1936 Paul D Japp is living in Cinncinati. He is an insurance agent. [1]

Paul D Japp to Mary E Jones, 15 May 1936, Maryville, Blount County, Tennessee [south of Knoxville. [12]

On 31 March 1938 a divorce suit was filed in Cincinnati - Paul D Japp vs Eleanor J Japp. [17]

In 1947 Paul and Grace were living in New York City when her mother died. [13]

In 1949, 1952, 1955 & 1957, Paul D Japp and wife Grace are living in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Paul works for the Pittsburg Corning Corp. He is a sales promotion manager, then sales manager, general sales manager and finally in 1957 vice president. [1]

Paul and Grace had several children, including daughters Judy and Barbara. [9, 10]

At the time of his death in 1968, Paul was living in Cincinnati, Ohio. [2]

Ann may have been manic. [5]

Ann committed suicide by shooting herself. She may have done it in a park or wooded area near her house. [5]

The Social Security Death Index lists Marjorie Hutton, born Oct 31, 1931, died May 1977. Her last residence was Robert, Tangipahoa Parish, Louisiana.

Marjorie Frith Hutton died 25 May 1977 at 10:30 AM. She was a native of Montgomery, Alabama, and a resident of Covington, Louisiana, for 12 years [since about 1965]. [4]

Steve's work required him to work overseas for extended periods, causing a strain in his marriage. By the fall of 1999 Steve and Landra agreed to divorce. Steve's brother Adam handled the divorce and with his power of attorney was the one who signed the divorce settlement. The divorce was finalized in August 2000. They remained on friendly terms. [3]

When Paul and Betty married in 1942 they were living in Birmingham. Paul was a

draftsman and Betty was a billing clerk. [2]

Paul (born 1921 in Alabama) was living in Jefferson County, AL, at the time he enlisted in the US Army. Paul enlisted on 20 Dec 1943 at Fort McClellan, AL. He had 2 years of college, and was working as a "Motorcycle Mechanic or Packer, High Explosives (Munitions worker, ammunition) or Toolroom Keeper or Stock Clerk or Stock Control Clerk". He is married. [1]

After two years, he left college and worked at various jobs. On October 3,1942, he married Betty Lou Breidenbach, she and Paul had been high school sweethearts. Paul's architectural firm was a family business. Betty Lou was the bookkeeper. And nephew Jack Hager was working there at the time of his death in 1966. In 1967, Paul and Herbert Hager partnered to build the Hager Building - an innovative commercial building on Oxmoor Road in Birmingham. Paul died June 20, 1986 in Birmingham at age 65. [3]

elementary education. She was a soloist with numerous choruses from grade school to college, and at her church. [3]

Dianne Murphree was first married to Stephen R Kaylor in April 1967 in Morgan County, Alabama. They divorced. Stephen Reynolds Kaylor died 4 December 2012. [1, 2]

A resident of Bessemer more than 50 years, Mrs. Stevenson moved to Birmingham about four years ago to live with her sister, Mrs. H. L. Jordan [Annie Hager]. Mrs. Stevenson went to Bessemer as a bride in 1890. A widely-known and beloved churchwoman, she was an acitve member of the First Presbyterian Church there for more than 50 years. She was president of the Women's Auxiliary 20 years. She was also a charter member of the Bessemer Music Club and a past president of the organization.

Bessie died 30 March 1949 at her home at 1528 Cleveland Avenue in Birmingham. She died of a cerebral hemorrhage she had suffered 8 days earlier. Arterio sclerosis was a secondary cause of death. [1]

In the 1900 Census, George (George Stephenson on the Census) is living in Bessemer, Jefferson County, Alabama. Living with him is his wife Bessie, brother James R Stevenson, cousin Robert V Swinson (Bessie's cousin Robert Swenson), and a black servant/cook, Georgia White. George and Bessie have been married 9 years. George and his brother were born in Ohio, as were their parents. George is a superintendent of waterworks.

In the 1910 Census, George Stevenson is living in Bessemer at 1925 Dartmouth Ave. He is 48 years old and born in Ohio. George is a real estate agent. Living with him is his wife Bessie Lee, 37, born in Alabama. George and Bessie have been married 18 years, and Bessie has not had any children. Also living with them is their cook, Ida Fonds? Ida is 31, mulatto, widowed, and born in Alabama. She has no children.

In the 1920 Census, George is living in Bessemer, Alabama, at 1925 Dartmouth Ave. He is 57 years old and born in Ohio. He is a real estate dealer. Living with him is his wife Bessie, 48 and born in Alabama. Bessie's parents were born in Sweden, and the city is listed on the census, but was not clear.

George Stevenson was a real estate and insurance man in Bessemer, Alabama. [History of Alabama and Her People, 1927 - listing for Charles J. Hager, Vol III]

In the 1930 Census, George is living in Bessemer, Alabama. Living with him is his wife Bessie, and Bessie's sister and brother-in-law Henry and Annie Jordan. Henry and Annie are listed as boarders. Also in the house is Julia Stearman(?), a boarder and cashier at a gas plant. George was born in Ohio, as were his parents. Bessie was born in Alabama. George is an agent in real estate.

From his obituary -

He was among the first settlers in Bessemer, coming here in June, 1887, after the city had been incorporated in April of the same year. Born in Ripley, Ohio, he had lived in Lexington, Ky., since early childhood until he came to Bessemer. He was educated as a civil engineer in the University of Kentucky, and assisted in surveying many of the streets in Bessemer when the city was first being laid off.

Mr. Stevenson was for many years superintendent of the Bessemer Land Company, and later was superintendent of the Bessemer Water Works. He served as secretary of the old Board of Trade in the early days of the city and was identified with many business interests. For many years he had been in the real estate business, and during the past few years had been associated with B. E. Ingram, real estate dealer.
